in the Comprehensive Case Information System, which shall be developed, operated, and maintained by of the Florida

Association of Court Clerks and Comptrollers, Inc., as agent of the clerks of the circuit court. The system serves as a secure, single point of access for searching statewide court information, provides access to court records, and contains electronic case data and any other data necessary to support the state court system. The clerks of the circuit court and shall submit electronic case data to the system based on the case types designated by the Supreme Court.

- (2) Records accessed through the system are official court records. A clerk of the circuit court is the official custodian of, and is responsible for, the court records and other data submitted by his or her office to the Comprehensive Case Information System.
- (3) Ownership and operation of the Comprehensive Case
  Information System may be transferred by the Florida Association
  of Court Clerks and Comptrollers, Inc., to an intergovernmental
  authority created by the clerks of the circuit court pursuant to
  chapter 163.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
