943.0413 Handgun Buyback and Safe Storage Grant Program.-

- (1) (a) The Handgun Buyback Grant Program is created within the department to award grants to support sheriffs' offices in sponsoring annual handgun buyback and safe storage events in their counties. Grants shall be provided if funds are appropriated for that purpose by law.
- (b) Funds specifically appropriated for the grant program pursuant to ss. 379.352, 790.06(4)(g), and 943.362 shall be awarded annually by the department to sheriffs' offices. The total amount of grants awarded may not exceed funding appropriated for the grant program.
- (2) As used in this section, the term "handgun" means a revolver, semiautomatic or automatic pistol, sawed-off shotgun, or assault weapon. The term does not include an antique handgun.
- (3) (a) An event funded under this section shall provide a cash payment of \$100 for each surrendered handgun that is in apparent operative condition. An individual may surrender multiple handguns, but the total cash payment to an individual may not exceed \$300.
- (b) An individual surrendering a handgun shall remain anonymous and any form of personal information or identification may not be required.
- (c) Weapons that do not qualify as a handgun under this section may be accepted, but do not qualify for a cash payment.

Active law enforcement personnel and gun dealers may surrender handguns but may not receive a cash payment.

- (d) Surrendered handguns must be destroyed and may not be sold.
- (4) An event funded under this section must promote and make available free cable gun locks and brochures that discuss safe handling and secure storage guidelines.
- (5) The department shall establish criteria and set specific time periods for the acceptance of applications and for the selection process for awards.
- Section 2. Subsection (13) of section 379.352, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 379.352 Recreational licenses, permits, and authorization numbers to take wild animal life, freshwater aquatic life, and marine life; issuance; costs; reporting.—
- any subagent authorized to sell licenses and permits under s. 379.3511 may request and collect donations when selling a recreational license or permit authorized under s. 379.354. The commission, any tax collector in this state, or any subagent authorized to sell licenses and permits under s. 379.3511 shall ask each person who applies for a recreational hunting license or permit if he or she would like to make a voluntary contribution of \$3 to support sheriffs' offices in sponsoring annual handgun buyback and safe storage events pursuant to s.

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943.0413. All donations collected under this subsection shall be deposited into the State Game Trust Fund to be used solely for the purpose of enhancing youth hunting and youth freshwater and saltwater fishing programs and supporting sheriffs' offices in sponsoring annual handgun buyback and safe storage events pursuant to s. 943.0413. By January 1, the commission shall provide a complete and detailed annual report on the status of its youth programs and activities performed under this subsection to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Section 3. Paragraph (g) is added to subsection (4) of section 790.06, Florida Statutes, to read:

790.06 License to carry concealed weapon or firearm.-

- (4) The application shall be completed, under oath, on a form adopted by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and shall include:
- (g) A check-off provision that allows the applicant to make a voluntary contribution of \$3 to support sheriffs' offices in sponsoring annual handgun buyback and safe storage events pursuant to s. 943.0413.
