## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, re	lating to	O

- 2 commissions and other agencies, so as to provide for the creation of the Georgia Endowment
- 3 for Teaching Professionals to foster a public-private partnership for support of postsecondary
- 4 teaching professionals in high demand courses, subjects, and disciplines; to provide for a
- 5 board of trustees; to provide for the membership, appointment, terms, and filling of vacancies
- 6 of the board of trustees; to provide for the creation, appointment, terms, filling of vacancies,
- 7 duties, and responsibilities of an advisory committee to the board of trustees; to provide for
- 8 the purposes of the endowment; to provide for the duties and responsibilities of the board of
- 9 trustees; to provide for discontinuation of the endowment under certain circumstances; to
- 10 provide for certain reports and audits; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 11 laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 14 Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to commissions
- and other agencies, is amended by revising Article 7, which is reserved, to read as follows:

- 18 (a) In order to foster a public-private partnership for the support of postsecondary teaching
- 19 professionals in high demand courses, subjects, and disciplines, there is created the Georgia
- 20 Endowment for Teaching Professionals. Such endowment shall be for the purpose of
- 21 receiving and distributing funds for the support of a program of endowments within the
- 22 <u>Technical College System of Georgia to support outstanding teaching professionals in high</u>
- demand courses, subjects, and disciplines in order to improve education and provide for
- 24 <u>economic development. The Georgia Endowment for Teaching Professionals shall not be</u>

25 an entity or agency of government, but shall be a private entity operating under and in accordance with the laws of this state. It is the intent of the General Assembly that such 26 27 private entity take all necessary steps to become a Section 501(c)(3) entity under the 28 Internal Revenue Code. 29 (b)(1) The Georgia Endowment for Teaching Professionals shall be governed by a board 30 of trustees consisting of 11 members. The members of the board shall include five 31 members appointed by the Governor, including the commissioner of the Technical College System of Georgia and the commissioner of economic development; three 32 33 members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and three members appointed by 34 Speaker of the House of Representatives. 35 (2) The Governor shall appoint one member to serve as chairperson of the board of 36 trustees. The board may elect such other officers as the board deems appropriate. The 37 board shall meet at the call of the chairperson or the request of any three members. 38 (c) The members of the board of trustees shall serve terms of four years and until their 39 successors are appointed and qualified; provided, however, that the initial terms of the three 40 members appointed by the Governor other than the commissioner of the Technical College 41 System of Georgia and the commissioner of economic development shall be for two years 42 and until their successors are appointed and qualified. Thereafter, such members shall 43 serve four-year terms and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The members 44 of the board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for actual and 45 reasonable expenses incurred while on the business of the endowment. 46 (d) The board of trustees shall appoint an advisory committee to assist the board members 47 in their duties. Such advisory committee shall consist of not more than 30 members and 48 shall be chaired by the executive director of the endowment. The advisory committee shall 49 include at least two representatives from each of the state's congressional districts. In 50 making its appointments, the board shall select members of the board of directors or 51 trustees of postsecondary institutions, local business or industry associations, and economic 52 development organizations; persons who have shown a commitment to education and workforce development in their communities; and persons who understand the needs of 53 54 business and education. The members of the advisory committee shall serve for four-year 55 terms and until their successors are selected and qualified; provided, however, that the 56 board of trustees shall designate 15 of the initial appointees to serve terms of two years and until their successors are selected and qualified. Such 15 members shall thereafter serve 57 four-year terms and until their successors are selected and qualified. The members of the 58 59 advisory committee shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for actual and 60 reasonable expenses incurred while on the business of the advisory committee.

- 62 <u>The Georgia Endowment for Teaching Professionals may have the following purposes:</u>
- 63 (1) To support through education the efforts of the Georgia Department of Economic
- 64 <u>Development</u>;
- 65 (2) To support the improvement of public postsecondary education in Georgia through
- 66 <u>the identification of key courses, subjects, and disciplines in demand for the development</u>
- of business and industry in this state;
- 68 (3) To provide annually to individual branches of the Technical College System of
- 69 Georgia grants in an amount and for a period of time to be determined by the board of
- 70 <u>trustees on a case-by-case basis to enable a teaching professional at such branch in one</u>
- or more of the key courses, subjects, or disciplines identified, based on competitive
- 72 <u>evaluation by the advisory committee or subcommittee of the various proposals;</u>
- 73 (4) To receive, invest, and administer funds received, including without limitation funds
- from the state, the federal government, private donations, grants, and other sources to
- 75 <u>fulfill the purposes for which the endowment is created;</u>
- 76 (5) To attract contributions and grants for the purposes of the endowment;
- 77 (6) To utilize funds of the endowment for matching dollars for federal and foundation
- grants to fulfill the purposes of the endowment; and
- 79 (7) To engage in other activities designed to support Georgia's postsecondary education
- 80 <u>systems' contribution to economic development and tourism.</u>

- The board of trustees shall have the following duties and responsibilities:
- 83 (1) To operate and manage the Georgia Endowment for Teaching Professionals,
- including the investment and reinvestment of the endowment's funds, the management
- of assets of the endowment, and the distribution of such funds and assets to fulfill the
- purpose of the endowment;
- 87 (2) To enter into contracts with public and private entities for services needed by the
- endowment and to fulfill the purposes of the endowment;
- 89 (3) To employ such staff and consultants as deemed necessary to fulfill the purposes of
- 90 <u>the endowment and to manage, invest, and administer funds and assets of the endowment:</u>
- 91 (4) To receive, retain, and invest donations, state and federal funding, grants, and other
- 92 <u>funds and assets; provided, however, that state funding and grants may not be expended</u>
- 93 <u>for the purposes of paragraph (3) of Code Section 50-12-111 but may be expended for</u>
- all other purposes of the endowment;
- 95 (5) To ensure that an annual independent audit is conducted of all funds and assets of the
- 96 <u>endowment;</u>

97 (6) To apply for and administer grants from public and private entities to fulfill the 98 purposes of the endowment, to assist branches of the Technical College System of 99 Georgia in obtaining and administering grants for these purposes, and to partner with 100 other organizations in order to obtain such grants; 101 (7) To institute and administer grant programs to fulfill the purposes of the endowment; 102 (8) To ensure that determinations of any public funding recipients shall be based not on 103 political expediency but rather on the project's contribution to the general welfare of its 104 intended audience and the project's demonstration of its relative ability to provide benefits 105 to this state and its citizens as quantified as required by paragraph (10) of this Code 106 section; 107 (9) To promote, fund, conduct, and assist in the development, provision, and expansion 108 of educational courses, subjects, and disciplines identified by the board as in demand for 109 the purpose of promoting the economic development of this state; (10) To develop a measurement consistent with state or national standards that will 110 111 ensure that information provided by the endowment in any report to the Governor and the 112 General Assembly concerning the impact of the endowment on education and economic 113 development have verifiable metrics in order to aid the General Assembly in determining 114 whether any public money expended in support of the endowment provides quantifiable 115 benefits to this state and its citizens; and (11) To perform such other tasks as may be appropriate to fulfill its purposes not 116 117 inconsistent with law. 118 <u>50-12-113.</u> 119 (a) No funds shall be expended by the board under the provisions of paragraphs (7) and (9) of Code Section 50-12-112 until contributions to the endowment from private donors 120 121 aggregate \$50,000.00 and funding and grants from public sources aggregate \$50,000.00. 122 In the event that contributions to the endowment do not meet the minimum requirements of this subsection by December 31, 2022, then the endowment shall be discontinued 123 124 effective July 1, 2023. In such event, during the period from December 31, 2022, to 125 June 30, 2023, the endowment shall take all reasonable and necessary steps to wind up its 126 affairs and to return any contributions to the donors thereof, public or private. In the event 127 that any contribution cannot be returned to the donor on or before June 30, 2023, the same 128 shall escheat to the state on July 1, 2023. (b) The funds and assets of the endowment shall be independently audited annually, and 129 130 the results of such audit shall be open to inspection at reasonable times by any person. A 131 copy of the audit report shall be sent to the state auditor and the state accounting officer.

132 (c) The board shall provide the Governor and the members of the General Assembly with
133 a full report of its activities and funds distribution in December of each year with
134 recommendations, if any, for legislation to assist the endowment in achieving its purposes.
135 The report shall include information on the impact of the endowment on education and
136 economic development, specifying the metric results using the measurement system
137 developed by the endowment as required in paragraph (10) of Code Section 50-12-112."

138 **SECTION 2.** 

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
