## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions regarding telephone service, so as to provide that a wireless
- 3 service supplier shall make location information of its subscribers available to law
- 4 enforcement agencies upon request; to provide for definitions; to provide for limitations; to
- 5 provide for immunity from suit for such wireless service suppliers under certain
- 6 circumstances; to provide for the collection and distribution of contact information; to
- 7 provide a short title; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 8 purposes.

## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

11 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Kelsey Smith Act."

12 SECTION 2.

- 13 Article 1 of Chapter 5 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 14 general provisions regarding telephone service, is amended by adding a new Code section
- 15 to read as follows:

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- 16 "<u>46-5-9.</u>
- 17 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Public safety answering point' shall have the same meaning as provided in Code
- 19 <u>Section 46-5-122.</u>
- 20 (2) 'Wireless service' shall have the same meaning as provided in Code Section 46-5-122.
- 21 (3) 'Wireless service supplier' shall have the same meaning as provided in Code
- 22 Section 46-5-122.
- 23 (b) Upon request of a law enforcement agency or a public safety answering point on behalf
- of a law enforcement agency, a wireless service supplier shall provide location information
- 25 <u>concerning the wireless service device of a user to the requesting law enforcement agency</u>
- or public safety answering point. A law enforcement agency or public safety answering
- 27 point shall not request information under this Code section except in the event of an
- 28 <u>emergency situation that involves the risk of death or serious physical harm.</u>
- 29 (c) A wireless service supplier may establish protocols by which such wireless service
- 30 <u>supplier voluntarily discloses location information.</u>
- 31 (d) A claim for relief shall not be brought in any court against any wireless service supplier
- 32 <u>or any other person for providing location information if acting in good faith and pursuant</u>
- 33 <u>to this Code section.</u>
- 34 (e) The Georgia Bureau of Investigation shall obtain contact information from all wireless
- 35 <u>service suppliers authorized to conduct business in this state to facilitate a request from a</u>
- 36 <u>law enforcement agency or a public safety answering point on behalf of a law enforcement</u>
- 37 <u>agency for location information pursuant to this Code section. The Georgia Bureau of</u>
- 38 <u>Investigation shall, upon request, disseminate such contact information to each law</u>
- 39 <u>enforcement agency and public safety answering point in this state."</u>

40 SECTION 3.

41 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
