A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 1 of Title 6, Chapter 80 of Title 36, Article 2A of Chapter 3 of Title 38, 1 and Part 1 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 3 relating to general provisions relative to aviation; provisions applicable to counties, 4 municipalities, corporations, and other governmental entities; general authority, duties, and 5 procedure for state purchasing; and the Board of Homeland Security, respectively, so as to 6 provide for the development of a list of approved unmanned aircraft systems by the Board 7 of Homeland Security; to provide for standards for the development of such list; to prohibit 8 the operation of unmanned aircraft systems in this state other than those upon such approved 9 list; to prohibit the purchase of unmanned aircraft systems not on such approved list by state 10 agencies or local governments; to exempt records relating to the development of an approved 11 unmanned aircraft system list from the Open Records Act; to provide for related matters; to 12 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

15	Chapter 1 of Title 6 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions
16	relative to aviation, is amended by revising Code Section 6-1-4, relating to unmanned aircraft
17	system defined, preemption for unmanned aircraft systems, and operations, as follows:

19	(a)(1) As used in this Code section, the term:
20	(1) 'Approved unmanned aircraft system' means an unmanned aircraft system approved
21	by the Board of Homeland Security pursuant to Code Section 38-3-43.
22	(2) 'Unmanned 'unmanned aircraft system' means a powered, aerial vehicle that is not a
23	satellite and that:
24	(A) Does not carry a human operator and is operated without the possibility of direct
25	human intervention from within or on the aircraft;
26	(B) Uses aerodynamic forces to provide vehicle lift;
27	(C) Can fly autonomously or be piloted remotely; and
28	(D) Can be expendable or recoverable.
29	(2) Such term shall not include a satellite.
30	(b) Any ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy of any county, municipality, or other
31	political subdivision of this state regulating the testing or operation of unmanned aircraft
32	systems shall be deemed preempted and shall be null, void, and of no force and effect;
33	provided, however, that a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state
34	may:
35	(1) Enforce any ordinance that was adopted on or before April 1, 2017;
36	(2) Adopt an ordinance that enforces Federal Aviation Administration restrictions; or
37	(3) Adopt an ordinance that provides for or prohibits the launch or intentional landing
38	of an unmanned aircraft system from or on its public property except with respect to the
39	operation of an <u>approved</u> unmanned aircraft system for commercial purposes; or

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40	(4) Adopt an ordinance that provides for the launch or intentional landing of an approved
41	unmanned aircraft system from or on its public property.
42	(c) The state, through agency or departmental rules and regulations, may provide for or
43	prohibit the launch or intentional landing of an unmanned aircraft system from or on its
44	public property. The state, through agency or departmental rules and regulations, may
45	provide for the launch or intentional landing of an approved unmanned aircraft system from
46	or on its public property."

- 64 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'unmanned aircraft system' shall have the same
 65 meaning as provided for in Code Section 6-1-4.
- 66 (b) No later than December 1, 2024, the board shall develop a list of unmanned aircraft
- 67 systems approved for use within this state. Such list shall be developed in coordination
- 68 with the Department of Administrative Services and shall include unmanned aircraft
- 69 systems determined by the board to be compliant with Federal Aviation Administration
- 70 standards and to present no threat to the security of this state. Such list shall be published
- 71 <u>upon the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency website.</u>
- 72 (c) The board shall review and update the list compiled pursuant to subsection (b) of this
- 73 <u>Code section every six months.</u> Any records of the board relative to the development of
