A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to general provisions relative to criminal trespass and damage to
- 3 property, so as to provide for additional acts committed with the intent of threatening safety
- 4 or provoking violence to constitute the offense of criminal trespass; to provide for a short
- 5 title; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "House of Worship Protection and Religious
- 9 Persecution Trespass Prevention Act."
- SECTION 2.
- 11 Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 12 relating to general provisions relative to criminal trespass and damage to property, is
- amended by revising Code Section 16-7-21, relating to criminal trespass, as follows:

- 14 "16-7-21.
- 15 (a) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass when he or she intentionally
- damages any property of another without consent of that other person and the damage
- thereto is \$500.00 or less or knowingly and maliciously interferes with the possession or
- use of the property of another person without consent of that person.
- 19 (b) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass when he or she knowingly and
- without authority:
- 21 (1) Enters upon the land or premises of another person or into any part of any vehicle,
- railroad car, aircraft, or watercraft of another person for an unlawful purpose;
- 23 (2) Enters upon the land or premises of another person or into any part of any vehicle,
- railroad car, aircraft, or watercraft of another person after receiving, prior to such entry,
- 25 notice from the owner, rightful occupant, or, upon proper identification, an authorized
- representative of the owner or rightful occupant that such entry is forbidden; or
- 27 (3) Remains upon the land or premises of another person or within the vehicle, railroad
- 28 car, aircraft, or watercraft of another person after receiving notice from the owner,
- rightful occupant, or, upon proper identification, an authorized representative of the
- 30 owner or rightful occupant to depart;
- 31 (4) Enters upon the land or premises of another person for the purpose of threatening the
- 32 safety of or provoking violence against the owner or any rightful occupant of such land
- 33 <u>or premises;</u>
- 34 (5) Dumps, places, throws, or otherwise causes a book, notice, handbill, poster, sign, bill,
- 35 <u>circular, pamphlet, letter, photograph, or other material object to enter and remain upon</u>
- 36 the land or premises of another person with reckless disregard for the substantial risk that
- 37 a reasonable person would conclude that the person or persons who commit such an act
- are a threat to the safety of any occupant of such land or premises; or
- 39 (6) Enters and remains upon the land or premises of another person with the intent to
- 40 <u>impede, disrupt, disturb, or interfere with an assembly of people convening for religious</u>

worship or observance or to engage in disorderly or disruptive conduct at a funeral or memorial service in violation of Code Section 16-11-34.2 for the purpose of threatening the safety of or provoking violence against those in attendance at such religious worship or observance or funeral or memorial service.

- (c) For the purposes of subsection (b) of this Code section, permission to enter or invitation to enter given by a minor who is or is not present on or in the property of the minor's parent or guardian is not sufficient to allow lawful entry of another person upon the land, premises, vehicle, railroad car, aircraft, or watercraft owned or rightfully occupied by such minor's parent or guardian if such parent or guardian has previously given notice that such entry is forbidden or notice to depart.
- 51 (d) A person who commits the offense of criminal trespass shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (e) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass when he or she intentionally 53 54 defaces, mutilates, or defiles any grave marker, monument, or memorial to one or more 55 deceased persons who served in the military service of this state, the United States of 56 America or any of the states thereof, or the Confederate States of America or any of the 57 states thereof, or a monument, plaque, marker, or memorial which is dedicated to, honors, 58 or recounts the military service of any past or present military personnel of this state, the 59 United States of America or any of the states thereof, or the Confederate States of America 60 or any of the states thereof if such grave marker, monument, memorial, plaque, or marker 61 is privately owned or located on land which is privately owned."
