The Senate Committee on Health and Human Services offered the following substitute to HB 215:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to health, so as to
- 2 provide for the certification of community health workers; to provide for definitions; to

- 9 Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to health, is amended by revising
- 10 Chapter 31, which is reserved, as follows:
- 11 "CHAPTER 31
- 12 31-31-1.
- 13 As used in this chapter, the term:

(1) 'Accreditation' means the process by which the department grants recognition and use

- of a credential to an eligible entity demonstrating satisfaction of the requirements for
- certification programs as provided for in Code Section 31-31-4.
- 17 (2) 'Certification' means the process by which the department grants recognition and use
- of a credential to an eligible individual demonstrating mastery of community health
- 19 worker core competencies as provided in this chapter.
- 20 (3) 'Certification program' means an education and training program for the certification
- of community health workers that meets accreditation requirements established by the
- 22 <u>CHWC Committee as provided for in Code Section 31-31-4.</u>
- 23 (4) 'Certified community health worker' means an individual to whom the CHWC
- 24 Committee has issued a certificate of competency to serve as a certified community
- 25 <u>health worker as provided for in Code Section 31-31-5.</u>
- 26 (5) 'CHWC Committee' or 'committee' means the Georgia Community Health Worker
- 27 Certification Committee established by Code Section 31-31-2.
- 28 (6) 'Community health worker' means a frontline health worker who is a trusted member
- of a community or has a demonstrated knowledge or unusually close understanding of
- the community and individuals served and:
- 31 (A) Provides culturally appropriate health education, information, and outreach in
- 32 <u>community based settings such as homes, schools, clinics, shelters, local businesses,</u>
- and community centers;
- 34 (B) Bridges or culturally mediates between individuals, communities, and health and
- 35 <u>human services, including actively building individual and community capacity;</u>
- 36 (C) Assures that community members access the services they need;
- 37 (D) Provides direct services, such as informal counseling, social support, care
- 38 <u>coordination</u>, and health screenings;
- 39 (E) Advocates for individual and community needs; and

40 <u>(F) Provides any additional services as may be identified by the CHWC Committee</u> 41 that may emerge in the development of community health worker practice.

- 42 (7) 'Core competency' means the knowledge and skills a certified community health
- worker is expected to demonstrate in order to carry out the mission and goals of the
- 44 profession. Such term includes but is not limited to communication skills; interpersonal
- 45 and relationship-building skills; service coordination and navigation skills;
- 46 capacity-building skills; advocacy skills; education and facilitation skills; individual and

- 50 (a) There is established the Georgia Community Health Worker Certification (CHWC)
- 51 <u>Committee. The Commissioner shall appoint the 11 voting members of the CHWC</u>
- 52 <u>Committee as follows:</u>
- 53 (1) One licensed physician with a specialization in chronic disease prevention and
- 54 treatment;
- 55 (2) One licensed physician with a specialization in maternal and child health;
- 56 (3) One licensed social worker;
- 57 (4) Two community health worker employers, with special consideration given to care
- management organizations;
- 59 (5) Two persons representing certification program providers;
- 60 (6) One person who represents the general public and is familiar with community health
- worker services;
- 62 (7) One person with experience and training in public health policy, with special
- consideration given to the Georgia Community Health Worker Advocacy Coalition; and
- 64 (8) Two practicing community health workers, with special consideration given to
- persons active in the Georgia Community Health Worker Network.

66 (b) The Commissioner shall appoint two agency representatives to serve as nonvoting

- 67 members of the CHWC Committee.
- 68 (c) Except for members appointed under subsection (b) of this Code section, those
- 69 members of the CHWC Committee who are initially appointed to the committee to
- 70 represent community health workers shall be persons who are eligible for certification as
- 71 community health workers and shall obtain such certification within a time frame specified
- in rules adopted by the committee.
- 73 (d) No member shall serve on the CHWC Committee for more than two consecutive full
- 74 terms. A member appointed for less than a full term may serve two consecutive full terms,
- and a former member shall be eligible again for appointment after a lapse of one or more
- 76 <u>years.</u>
- 77 (e) Members of the CHWC Committee may be removed from office under the same
- 78 conditions for removal from office of members of professional licensing boards provided
- 79 <u>in Code Section 43-1-17.</u>
- 80 (f) Members shall serve without compensation, but they may be reimbursed by the
- 81 department, subject to fund availability, in the same manner as state officials and
- 82 <u>employees for travel and other expenses actually incurred by them in carrying out their</u>
- duties as members of the CHWC Committee.
- 84 31-31-3.
- 85 (a) The CHWC Committee shall meet at least quarterly and may meet at such other times
- at the call of the chairperson or by a majority of the members as necessary to transact its
- business. Such meetings may be conducted in-person, by telephone, by virtual means, or
- any combination thereof.
- 89 (b) The CHWC Committee shall elect a chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary from
- among its membership. Such officers shall serve for terms of two years.

91 (c) A majority of the members of the CHWC Committee shall constitute a quorum and

- 92 <u>shall have the authority to act upon any matter properly brought before the committee. The</u>
- 93 committee shall follow all policies and procedures of Chapter 14 of Title 50, relating to
- 94 open and public meetings.
- 95 (d) The department shall provide reasonably necessary administrative support for CHWC
- 96 <u>Committee activities.</u>
- 97 (e) The CHWC Committee shall have the following powers and duties:
- 98 (1) To set standards and requirements for the accreditation of certification programs and
- 99 <u>to provide a means for programs providing education and training to community health</u>
- workers prior to July 1, 2024, to become accredited certification programs;
- 101 (2) To set standards and requirements for the certification of community health workers
- and to provide a means for individuals employed or engaged as community health
- workers prior to July 1, 2024, to become certified community health workers;
- 104 (3) To set standards and a means to assess community health worker competency for
- 105 certification;
- 106 (4) To provide for an expedited means for a community health worker duly certified in
- another jurisdiction to become a certified community health worker in this state;
- 108 (5) To establish tiered levels of practice as a certified community health worker and the
- requirements for each established level, including a level that qualifies a certified
- community health worker to act as an educator or trainer in an accredited certification
- program;
- 112 (6) To establish grounds for complaints related to the practice of certified community
- health workers and to establish and implement procedures for the review, investigation,
- and resolution of such complaints;
- 115 (7) To establish the disciplinary procedures and actions available to the department in
- connection with complaint resolution; such actions may include a fine, reprimand,

probation, censure, suspension, revocation, denial of a certificate issued, or a combination 117 118 of the foregoing; and 119 (8) To perform such other functions and duties in order to protect public health, safety 120 and welfare as may be required to carry out this chapter. 31-31-4. 121 122 (a) All certification programs shall be accredited by the CHWC Committee with oversight from the department. No entity shall hold itself out as providing training and education for 123 certified community health workers in this state unless its curriculum and training program 124 has been accredited by the CHWC Committee. 125 (b) The department shall post on its website the accreditation requirements and the 126 application form for a certification program. 127 (c) To obtain accreditation for a certification program, an applicant shall submit an 128 application to the CHWC Committee demonstrating satisfaction of accreditation 129 130 requirements for a certification program and pay to the department a fee set by the department." 131 132 **SECTION 2.** 133 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law 134 without such approval.
