The House Committee on Rules offers the following substitute to HB 282:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 5 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to investigation of sexual assault, so as to increase the amount of time that law
- 3 enforcement agencies are required to preserve certain evidence of sexual assault; to provide
- 4 for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 7 Article 4 of Chapter 5 of Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 8 investigation of sexual assault, is amended by revising Code Section 17-5-71, relating to
- 9 preservation of evidence, as follows:
- 10 "17-5-71.
- 11 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this Code section or Code Section
- 12 17-5-55 or 17-5-56, on or after May 12, 2008, the investigating law enforcement agency
- shall maintain any physical evidence collected as a result of an alleged sexual assault that
- 14 contains biological material, including, but not limited to, stains, fluids, or hair samples that
- relate to the identity of the perpetrator of an alleged sexual assault, for ten years after the
- 16 report of the alleged sexual assault.
- 17 (b) If the victim does not cooperate with law enforcement in the investigation or
- prosecution of an alleged sexual assault, the investigating law enforcement agency shall
- maintain any physical evidence collected as a result of such alleged sexual assault that
- 20 contains biological material, including, but not limited to, stains, fluids, or hair samples that
- relate to the identity of the perpetrator of the alleged sexual assault, for not less than 12
- 22 months from the date any such physical evidence is collected."

SECTION 2.

24 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
