## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to selling
- 2 and other trade practices, so as to require a manufacturer to provide certain items necessary
- 3 for diagnostic, maintenance, or repair services on digital products; to provide for a short title;
- 4 to provide for definitions; to provide for enforcement, limitations, exclusions, and
- 5 applicability; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 6 purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to selling and other
- 10 trade practices, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>ARTICLE 35</u>
- 12 10-1-930.
- 13 This article shall be known and may be cited as the 'Right to Repair Act.'
- 14 <u>10-1-931.</u>
- 15 As used in this article, the term:
- (1) 'Authorized repair provider' means any person that is unaffiliated with an original
- equipment manufacturer and that, through an arrangement with such manufacturer
- existing for a definite or indefinite period of time, offers diagnostic, maintenance, or
- repair services for digital electronic equipment under the trade name, service mark, or
- 20 <u>other proprietary identifier of the original equipment manufacturer.</u> Such term shall
- 21 <u>include any original equipment manufacturer that offers diagnostic, maintenance, or</u>
- 22 repair services for the digital electronic equipment of another original equipment
- 23 <u>manufacturer through an arrangement.</u>

- 24 (2) 'Dealer' shall have the same meaning as set forth in Code Section 10-1-622.
- 25 (3) 'Digital electronic equipment' means any product that depends, in whole or in part,
- on digital electronics embedded in or attached to the product for its functioning.
- 27 (4) 'Documentation' means any manual, diagram, reporting output, service code
- 28 <u>description, schematic diagram, or similar kind of information provided to an authorized</u>
- 29 repair provider in order to provide diagnostic, maintenance, repair, or other services for
- 30 <u>digital electronic equipment.</u>
- 31 (4) 'Embedded software' means any programmable instructions provided on firmware
- 32 <u>delivered with digital electronic equipment, or with a part for such equipment, for</u>
- purposes of equipment operation, including all relevant patches and fixes made by the
- 34 <u>manufacturer of such equipment or part for such purposes.</u>
- 35 (5) 'Fair and reasonable terms' means at costs and under terms, including terms for
- 36 convenience of delivery, equivalent to what is offered by the original equipment
- 37 <u>manufacturer to an authorized repair provider, using the net costs that would be incurred</u>
- 38 by an authorized repair provider in obtaining an equivalent part or tool or documentation
- from the original equipment manufacturer and accounting for any discounts, rebates, or
- 40 <u>other incentive programs in arriving at the actual net costs; provided, however, that when</u>
- 41 <u>such term is used in relation to documentation and relevant updates, such term means at</u>
- 42 <u>no charge, except that when the documentation is requested in physical printed form, a</u>
- 43 charge may be included for the reasonable actual costs of preparing and sending the copy.
- 44 (6) 'Firmware' means a software program or set of instructions programmed on digital
- 45 <u>electronic equipment, or on a part for such equipment, to allow the equipment or part to</u>
- 46 <u>communicate with other computer hardware.</u>
- 47 (7) 'Independent service provider' means any person engaged in diagnostic, maintenance,
- 48 repair, or other services for digital electronic equipment that does not have an
- 49 <u>arrangement to provide such services as or on behalf of an authorized repair provider.</u>
- 50 (8) 'Locked' means secured by an electronic security lock or other security related
- 51 <u>function</u>.
- 52 (9) 'Motor vehicle' means a vehicle that is designed for transporting persons or property
- on a highway and is certified by the manufacturer under all applicable federal safety and
- 54 <u>emissions standards and requirements for distribution and sale in the United States. Such</u>
- 55 term shall not include motorcycles, as defined in Code Section 40-1-1, and recreational
- vehicles, as defined in Code Section 10-1-679.
- 57 (10) 'Motor vehicle manufacturer' means any person engaged in the business of making
- or assembling new motor vehicles.

59 (11) 'Necessary service materials' means the documentation, parts, and tools, including

- any updates to information or embedded software, required to provide diagnostic,
- 61 <u>maintenance, repair, or other services.</u>
- 62 (12) 'Original equipment manufacturer' means a person engaged in the business of selling
- 63 new digital electronic equipment manufactured by or on behalf of such person. Such
- 64 <u>term shall include a person engaged in the business of selling new digital electronic</u>
- equipment which is sold under a financing or periodic payment plan.
- 66 (13) 'Owner' means any person that owns digital electronic equipment purchased or used
- 67 <u>in this state. Such term shall include ownership of digital electronic equipment purchased</u>
- 68 <u>under a financing or periodic payment plan.</u>
- 69 (14) 'Part' means any replacement part, either new or used, made available by an original
- 70 equipment manufacturer in order to provide maintenance or repair of digital electronic
- 71 equipment manufactured or sold by the original equipment manufacturer.
- 72 (15) 'Person' means an individual, partnership, corporation, company, or association.
- 73 (16) 'Trade secret' shall have the same meaning as provided for in Code
- 74 <u>Section 10-1-761.</u>
- 75 (17) 'Unlocking materials' means any special documentation, tools, and parts needed to
- 76 reset a lock or function in digital electronic equipment that becomes locked or disabled
- 77 <u>during diagnosis, maintenance, or repair.</u>
- 78 <u>10-1-932.</u>
- 79 (a) An original equipment manufacturer shall make available to any independent service
- 80 provider or owner of digital electronic equipment any necessary service materials on fair
- 81 <u>and reasonable terms. Such documentation, tools, and parts may be made available</u>
- 82 through systems designed for secured release.
- 83 (b) An original equipment manufacturer shall make available any unlocking materials to
- 84 any independent service provider or owner of digital electronic equipment that is locked
- 85 <u>on fair and reasonable terms.</u>
- 86 (c) Nothing in this Code section shall require an original equipment manufacturer to make
- 87 <u>available any part that is no longer available to the original equipment manufacturer.</u>
- 88 <u>10-1-933.</u>
- 89 A violation of this article constitutes an unfair or deceptive practice in consumer
- 90 <u>transactions within the meaning of Part 2 of Article 15 of Chapter 1 of Title 10, the 'Fair</u>
- 91 <u>Business Practices Act of 1975.' All remedies, penalties, and authority granted to the</u>
- 92 Attorney General by that Act shall be available for the enforcement of this article.

- 94 (a) Nothing in this article shall be construed to require an original equipment manufacturer
- 95 <u>to divulge a trade secret to an owner or independent service provider except to provide</u>
- 96 <u>necessary service materials or unlocking materials.</u>
- 97 (b) No provision of this article shall be construed to alter the terms of any arrangement in
- 98 force between an authorized repair provider and an original equipment manufacturer,
- 99 <u>including</u>, but not limited to, the performance or provision of warranty or recall repair work
- by an authorized repair provider on behalf of an original equipment manufacturer pursuant
- 101 to such arrangement, except that any provision in such terms that purports to waive, avoid,
- restrict, or limit the original equipment manufacturer's obligations to comply with this
- article shall be void and unenforceable.
- 104 (c) Nothing in this article shall require an original equipment manufacturer or an
- authorized repair provider to provide to an owner or independent service provider access
- to information, other than documentation, that is not otherwise provided by the original
- equipment manufacturer to an authorized repair provider necessary in order to provide
- diagnostic, maintenance, or repair services.

- Nothing in this article shall apply to a motor vehicle manufacturer, manufacturer of motor
- vehicle equipment, or dealer acting in such capacities or to any product or service of a
- motor vehicle manufacturer, manufacturer of motor vehicle equipment, or dealer acting in
- such capacities.

- This article shall apply to equipment sold or in use on or after July 1, 2019."

- All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
