A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to student health in elementary and secondary education, so as to
- 3 authorize public and private schools to stock a supply of auto-injectable epinephrine; to
- 4 provide for definitions; to provide for requirements and reporting; to provide for
- 5 arrangements with manufacturers; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for limited
- 6 liability; to amend Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating
- 7 to pharmacists and pharmacies, so as to authorize licensed health practitioners to prescribe
- 8 auto-injectable epinephrine for schools; to authorize pharmacists to fill such prescriptions;
- 9 to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 10 for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 13 Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 14 relating to student health in elementary and secondary education, is amended by adding a
- 15 new Code section to read as follows:
- 16 "<u>20-2-776.2.</u>
- 17 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Auto-injectable epinephrine' means a disposable drug delivery device that is easily
- 19 <u>transportable and contains a premeasured single dose of epinephrine used to treat</u>
- 20 <u>life-threatening allergic reactions.</u>
- 21 (2) 'Licensed practitioner' means a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state,
- 22 <u>an advanced practice registered nurse acting pursuant to the authority of Code Section</u>
- 23 <u>43-34-25</u>, and a physician assistant acting pursuant to the authority of subsection (e.1) of
- 24 <u>Code Section 43-34-103.</u>
- 25 (b) A public or private school in this state may acquire and stock a supply of
- 26 <u>auto-injectable epinephrine pursuant to a prescription issued in accordance with Code</u>

27 <u>Section 26-4-116.1.</u> A public or private school shall designate an employee or agent

- 28 <u>trained in the possession and administration of auto-injectable epinephrine who shall be</u>
- 29 <u>responsible for the storage, maintenance, and distribution of the auto-injectable epinephrine</u>
- 30 stocked by the school.
- 31 (c) Any school employee or agent of a public or private school who has completed training
- 32 <u>or received information in accordance with subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-776.1 in</u>
- 33 recognizing the symptoms of anaphylactic shock and the correct method of administering
- 34 <u>the auto-injectable epinephrine may:</u>
- 35 (1) Provide auto-injectable epinephrine to any student such employee or agent believes
- 36 <u>in good faith is experiencing an anaphylactic adverse reaction for immediate</u>
- 37 <u>self-administration; or</u>
- 38 (2) Administer auto-injectable epinephrine to any student such employee or agent
- 39 <u>believes in good faith is experiencing an anaphylactic adverse reaction in accordance with</u>
- 40 <u>a standing protocol from the prescribing licensed practitioner,</u>
- 41 <u>regardless of whether the student has a prescription for auto-injectable epinephrine.</u>
- 42 (d) A public or private school may enter into arrangements with manufacturers of
- 43 <u>approved auto-injectable epinephrine or third-party suppliers of auto-injectable epinephrine</u>
- 44 <u>to obtain the products free of charge or at fair market or reduced prices.</u>
- 45 (e) No later than July 1, 2013, the State Board of Education, in consultation with the
- Department of Public Health, shall adopt regulations as necessary to implement the
- 47 provisions of this Code section.
- 48 (f)(1) Any school personnel who in good faith administers or chooses not to administer
- 49 <u>epinephrine to a student pursuant to this Code section shall be immune from civil liability</u>
- for any act or omission to act related to the administration of epinephrine, except that
- 51 <u>such immunity shall not apply to an act of willful or wanton misconduct.</u>
- 52 (2) Any licensed practitioner who prescribes auto-injectable epinephrine pursuant to
- 53 <u>Code Section 26-4-116.1 for use by a school in accordance with this Code section shall</u>
- 54 <u>be immune from civil liability for any act or omission to act related to the administration</u>
- of such auto-injectable epinephrine, except that such immunity shall not apply to an act
- of willful or wanton misconduct."
- 57 SECTION 2.
- 58 Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to pharmacists and
- 59 pharmacies, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 60 "<u>26-4-116.1.</u>
- 61 (a) A physician licensed to practice medicine in this state, an advanced practice registered
- 62 <u>nurse acting pursuant to the authority of Code Section 43-34-25, and a physician assistant</u>

- acting pursuant to the authority of subsection (e.1) of Code Section 43-34-103 may
 prescribe auto-injectable epinephrine in the name of a public or private school for use in
 accordance with Code Section 20-2-776.2 and in accordance with protocol specified by
 such physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or physician assistant.

 (b) A pharmacist may dispense auto-injectable epinephrine pursuant to a prescription
 issued in accordance with subsection (a) of this Code section."
- 69 **SECTION 3.**
- 70 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law71 without such approval.
- 72 SECTION 4.
- All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
