House Bill 360 By: Representative Marin of the 96th

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and 1 2 traffic, so as to provide for the issuance of driving cards to noncitizen residents who are ineligible for a driver's license, temporary permit, or identification card; to revise a definition 3 and provide for a definition; to provide for an exception to the requirement that the 4 5 Department of Driver Services utilize a certain program; to provide for application requirements for such driving cards; to provide for standards for the appearance of such 6 cards; to provide for minimum age for issuance of such cards; to provide for fees for issuance 7 8 and renewal of such cards; to provide for expiration of such cards; to provide for related 9 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11	SECTION 1.
12	Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
13	amended in Code Section 40-1-1, relating to definitions relative to identification and
14	regulation, by revising paragraph (24) as follows:
15	"(24) 'License' or 'license to operate a motor vehicle' means any driver's license or any
16	other license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under, or granted by, the laws
17	of this state, including:
18	(A) Any temporary license or instruction permit;
19	(B) The privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle whether or not such person
20	holds a valid license; and
21	(C) Any nonresident's operating privilege as defined in this Code section; and
22	(D) Any driving card, except when such term is used in connection with any issuance
23	requirements in Code Sections 40-5-20, 40-5-21.1 through 40-5-22, 40-5-25, and
24	40-5-32."

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25	SECTION 2.
26	Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-21.2, relating to compliance with
27	Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Program, application, and implementation,
28	by adding a new subsection to read as follows:
29	"(e) This Code section shall not apply to applications for driving cards pursuant to Code
30	Section 40-5-21.3."
31	SECTION 3.
32	Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
33	<u>"40-5-21.3.</u>
34	(a) The department shall issue a driving card to any noncitizen who is ineligible for a
35	temporary license, permit, or special identification card pursuant to Code Section 40-5-21.1
36	upon application to the department in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by
37	the commissioner. Such application shall require the submission of:
38	(1) Valid documentary evidence that such applicant is a state resident including, but not
39	limited to:
40	(A) A notarized copy of a lease or rental agreement for property located in this state;
41	(B) Records of school enrollment in a Georgia public or private school for the
42	applicant or his or her child;
43	(C) A copy of a current utility bill in the applicant's name;
44	(D) A copy of a tax related filing; or
45	(E) Any other documentation deemed appropriate by the commissioner;
46	(2) Proof of completion of an approved driver education course in a licensed private or
47	public driver training school or immediate possession of a valid driver's license from a
48	foreign country or another jurisdiction; and
49	(3) Payment of the issuance fee as prescribed by the department.
50	Such driving card shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance and may be renewed
51	upon resubmitting an application along with valid documentary evidence of state residence
52	and payment of the renewal fee as prescribed by the department.
53	(b) The department is authorized to design a driving card to be issued pursuant to this
54	Code section. Such driving card shall be distinctive in appearance from a driver's license,
55	permit, or identification card; shall be of vertical orientation; and shall clearly and
56	prominently display the date of expiration and a phrase substantially similar to 'FOR
57	DRIVING PRIVILEGES ONLY-NOT VALID FOR IDENTIFICATION'. Such driving
58	card shall indicate the type or general class of vehicles the cardholder may drive, bear
59	thereon a distinguishing number assigned to the cardholder, include a recent photograph
60	of the cardholder, and include the following information:

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61	(1) Full legal name;
62	(2) Address of residence;
63	(3) Birth date;
64	(4) Date driving card was issued;
65	<u>(5) Sex;</u>
66	(6) Height;
67	(7) Weight;
68	(8) Eye color;
69	(9) Signature of person identified or facsimile thereof; and
70	(10) Such other information or identification as required by the department.
71	(c) For purposes of this Code section, the term 'resident' means a person who has a
72	permanent home or abode in this state to which, whenever such person is absent, he or she
73	has the intention of returning. There is a rebuttable presumption that the following person
74	is a resident:
75	(1) Any person who accepts employment or engages in any trade, profession, or
76	occupation in this state or enters his or her children to be educated in a private or public
77	school of this state within ten days after the commencement of such employment or
78	education; or
79	(2) Any person who, except for infrequent, brief absences, has been present in the state
80	for 30 days or more."

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SECTION 4.

82 Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-22, relating to persons not to be licensed,

83 minimum ages for licensees, school enrollment requirements, driving training requirements,

84 and limited driving permits, by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

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SECTION 5.

Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-25, relating to applications, fees, waiver
of fees, and provisions for voluntary participation in various programs, by revising
subsections (a) and (c) as follows:

91 "(a) Every application for an instruction permit or for a, driver's license, or driving card
92 shall be made upon a form furnished by the department. Every application shall be
93 accompanied by the proper license fee. The fees shall be as established by the Board of
94 Driver Services, not to exceed:

The commissioner may by rule provide incentive discounts in otherwise applicable fees
reflecting cost savings to the department where when a license is renewed by means other

than personal appearance. The discount for renewal of a Class C or Class M license and 131 any other discounts shall be as determined by the commissioner. Except as provided in 132 133 Code Section 40-5-36, relating to veterans' licenses, and Code Section 40-5-149, relating 134 to application fees for public school bus drivers, there shall be no exceptions to the fee 135 requirements for a commercial driver's license or a commercial driver's license permit. 136 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code section, there shall be no fee whatsoever 137 for replacement of any driver's license or driving card solely due to a change of the licensee's or cardholder's name or address, provided that such replacement license or card 138 139 shall be valid only for the remaining period of such original license or card; and provided, further, that only one such free replacement license or driving card may be obtained within 140 the period for which the license or driving card was originally issued. Any application for 141 142 the replacement of a lost license or driving card pursuant to Code Section 40-5-31 or due to a change in the licensee's or cardholder's name or address submitted within 150 days of 143 the expiration of said license or card shall be treated as an application for renewal subject 144 to the applicable license fees as set forth in this subsection. The maximum period for 145 which any driver's license shall be issued is eight years. The maximum period for which 146 any driving card shall be issued is one year." 147

148 "(c) Every such application shall state the full legal name, date of birth, sex, and residence 149 address of the applicant; shall briefly describe the applicant; shall state whether the 150 applicant has theretofore been licensed as a driver and, if so, when and by what state or 151 country, and whether any such license has ever been suspended, revoked, or refused, and, 152 if so, the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation, or refusal; and shall state such 153 other information as the commissioner may require to determine the applicant's identity, competence, and eligibility. The application shall include any other information as 154 155 required by paragraph (1) of subsection (a.1) of Code Section 19-11-9.1. The department 156 shall not issue a license or driving card until a complete examination of the applicant's record has been completed. The commissioner may issue such rules and regulations as 157 shall be necessary for the orderly processing of license and card applications." 158

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SECTION 6.

Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 40-5-32, relating to expiration andrenewal of licenses and reexamination required, as follows:

162 *"*40-5-32.

(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this Code section, every driver's license shall
expire on the licensee's birthday in the eighth year following the issuance of such license.
Notwithstanding the foregoing, any commercial driver's license that contains an H or X
endorsement as defined in subsection (c) of Code Section 40-5-150 shall expire on the

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date of expiration of the licensee's security threat assessment conducted by the 167 Transportation Security Administration of the United States Department of Homeland 168 169 Security.

(2) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (c) of this Code section, every veteran's, 170 honorary, or distinctive license shall expire on the licensee's birthday in the eighth year 171 following the issuance thereof. The department may allow a veteran, honorary, or 172 distinctive license holder to retain his or her expired veteran's, honorary, or distinctive 173 174 license as a souvenir.

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(3) Every driving card shall expire one year from the date of issuance.

- (4) Every driver's license shall be renewed on or before its expiration date upon 176 application, payment of the required fee, and, if applicable, satisfactory completion of the 177 examination required by subsection (c) of this Code section. Nothing in this Code section 178 shall be interpreted as affecting the rights and privileges of any person holding a 179 veteran's, honorary, or distinctive license, or authorizing the imposition of a charge or fee 180 for the issuance or renewal of such licenses. 181
- (4)(5) The commissioner shall issue such rules and regulations as are required to enforce 182 183 this subsection.
- 184 (b) An application for driver's license renewal may be submitted by means of:

185 (1) Personal appearance before the department; or

(2) Subject to rules or regulations of the department which shall be consistent with 186 187 considerations of public safety and efficiency of service to licensees, means other than 188 such personal appearance which may include without limitation by mail or electronically. The department may by such rules or regulations exempt persons renewing drivers' 189 licenses under this paragraph from the license surrender requirement of subsection (c) of 190 191 Code Section 40-5-20.

- (c)(1) The department shall require every person who is age 64 or older applying for 192 193 issuance or renewal of a driver's license to take and pass successfully such test of his or her eyesight as the department shall prescribe. 194
- (2) The commissioner may issue such rules and regulations as are necessary to 195 implement this subsection." 196
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SECTION 7.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed. 198
