## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- To amend Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1
- 2 relating to prestige license plates and special plates for certain persons and vehicles, so as to
- 3 establish a special license plate for graduates of the United States Army Airborne School; to
- 4 provide for procedures, conditions, and limitations upon issuance of such license plates; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 6

7 **SECTION 1.** 

- 8 Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 prestige license plates and special plates for certain persons and vehicles, is amended by
- 10 adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>40-2-66.1.</u>

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- 12 (a) Motor vehicle owners who are graduates of the United States Army Airborne School
- 13 shall, upon application for a license plate and upon compliance with the state motor vehicle
- laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles as prescribed under this chapter 14
- 15 for private passenger cars, motorcycles, or trucks used for personal transportation, be
- 16 issued a license plate free of charge. Each graduate of the United States Army Airborne
- School shall be entitled to no more than one such free license plate at a time; provided, 17
- however, that, upon payment of the regular license fee provided for in Code Section 18
- 40-2-151 and a manufacturing fee of \$25.00, a graduate shall be entitled to one additional 19
- 20 such license plate. For each additional license plate for which an initial \$25.00 fee is
- required, there shall be an additional annual registration fee of \$25.00, which fee shall be 22 collected by the county tag agent at the time of collection of other registration fees and
- shall be remitted to the state as provided in Code Section 40-2-34. Additional words or 23
- 24 symbols, in addition to the numbers and letters prescribed by law, shall be inscribed upon
- 25 such license plates so as to identify distinctively the owner as a graduate of the United
- 26 States Army Airborne School. The adjutant general of Georgia shall, upon request of any

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graduate of the United States Army Airborne School, furnish to such graduate approved

documentation supporting the graduate's status. Such documentation shall be presented to 28 29 the tax commissioner of the county in which the graduate of the United States Army 30 Airborne School applies for the special license plate under this Code section and upon 31 subsequent reregistration for each succeeding year. 32 (b) Upon transfer of the ownership of a private passenger vehicle for which there is a 33 license plate issued pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code section and upon acquisition by the graduate of the United States Army Airborne School of another motor vehicle, the 34 35 license plate issued pursuant to this Code section shall be placed on such newly acquired 36 motor vehicle and such graduate shall notify the commissioner of such transfer of the 37 license plate to such newly acquired motor vehicle in such manner as the commissioner 38 may prescribe by regulation and shall pay a transfer and cancellation fee of \$5.00 and any 39 applicable license fee for the newly acquired vehicle. A transfer and cancellation fee shall 40 not be charged for the transfer of a free United States Army Airborne School license plate. 41 (c) The commissioner shall make such rules and regulations as necessary to enforce 42 compliance with all state license laws relating to the use and operation of a private 43 passenger vehicle before issuing United States Army Airborne School license plates in lieu 44 of the regular Georgia license plates, and all applications for such plates shall be made to 45 the commissioner. The commissioner is specifically authorized to promulgate all rules and regulations necessary to make adequate provision for instances in which such vehicles have 46 47 been transferred or sold. Except as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, such 48 license plates shall be nontransferable."

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50 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
