The House Committee on Education offers the following substitute to HB 589:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to education accountability assessment programs, so as to create the Georgia
- 3 Commission on Civics Education; to provide for membership, filling of vacancies, terms,
- 4 officers, duties, meetings, and reimbursement of members of the commission; to provide for
- 5 a short title; to provide for legislative intent; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for
- 6 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "The Georgia Civics Renewal Act."

SECTION 2.

- 11 Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

- 16 (a) There is created the Georgia Commission on Civics Education.
- 17 (b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the commission shall promote and enhance
- the education of students on the importance of civic involvement in a constitutional
- 19 republic, the study of state and local government among the state's citizenry, the
- 20 <u>importance of civic engagement and public service, and communication and collaboration</u>
- 21 <u>among organizations in the state that conduct civics education.</u>
- 22 (c)(1) The commission shall consist of 17 members comprising one member from the
- Senate majority caucus, one member from the Senate minority caucus, one member from
- 24 the House of Representatives majority caucus, one member from the House of
- 25 Representatives minority caucus, one Justice of the Supreme Court, the Attorney General,
- one designee from the Georgia Chamber of Commerce, one designee from the Metro
- 27 Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, the State School Superintendent or his or her designee,
- one other member as determined by the President of the Senate, one other member as
- determined by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one other member as
- determined by the Governor, two former or current government or civics teachers
- 31 appointed by the Governor, one representative from the Association County
- Commissioners of Georgia, one representative from the Georgia Municipal Association,
- and one representative from the Georgia Center for Civic Engagement appointed by the
- 34 Governor.
- 35 (2) Vacancies in the commission shall be filled the same as the original appointments.
- 36 (3)(A) Legislative members of the commission shall serve two-year terms concurrent
- with their terms as members of the General Assembly.
- 38 (B) Nonlegislative members of the commission shall serve two-year terms concurrent
- with those terms of legislative members of the commission.

40 (d) The Governor shall designate the chairperson of the commission. The chairperson 41 shall serve as such concurrent with his or her term as a member of the commission. 42 (e)(1) The commission shall periodically review the conditions, needs, issues, and 43 problems related to civics education in Georgia schools, issue annually a report on the same to the General Assembly, and recommend any action or legislation which the 44 45 commission deems necessary or appropriate. (2) The commission may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it 46 47 may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this Code 48 49 section. The commission shall meet upon the call of the chairperson. The commission 50 shall meet not less than two nor more than four times annually. (3) The legislative members of the commission shall receive the allowances provided for 51 52 in Code Section 28-1-8. Any citizen members shall receive a daily expense allowance 53 in the amount specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21, as well as the mileage 54 or transportation allowance authorized for state employees. Any members of the commission who are state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees 55 56 shall receive no compensation for their services on the commission, but they shall be 57 reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties as members 58 of the commission in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their 59 capacities as state officials or employees. The funds necessary for the reimbursement of 60 the expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall come from funds appropriated to the Department of Education. All other funds necessary 61 62 to carry out the provisions of this Code section shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives and the Senate. The expenses and allowances authorized by 63 64 this paragraph shall not be received by members of the commission for more than four 65 days annually.

66 (f) The head of the social studies program of the Department of Education shall report

- annually to the commission regarding the conditions, needs, issues, and problems of the
- 68 program.
- 69 (g) This part shall stand repealed on December 31, 2028."
- 70 **SECTION 3.**
- 71 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- without such approval.
- 73 **SECTION 4.**
- All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
