A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 1 2 physicians, assistants, and others, so as to provide for the refusal, suspension, or revocation 3 of the license of a physician who has committed a sexual assault on a patient; to provide for mandatory reporting by health care professionals who have reasonable cause to believe that 4 5 a physician has committed a sexual assault on a patient; to provide for definitions; to provide for limited liability; to amend Chapter 34A of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia 6 Annotated, relating to patient right to know, so as to provide for annual reporting to the 7 8 General Assembly of the number of physicians investigated or disciplined for the sexual assault of patients; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters; to repeal 9 10 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

12	SECTION 1.
13	Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to physicians,
14	assistants, and others, is amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 43-34-8,
15	relating to the authority of the Georgia Composite Medical Board to refuse license,
16	certificate, or permit or issue discipline, to read as follows:
17	"(b.2) The board shall refuse to grant a license to an applicant, or suspend or revoke an
18	existing license of a physician who:
19	(1) The board has found, after conducting an investigation, to have committed a sexual
20	assault on a patient:
21	(2) Has pleaded guilty to committing a sexual assault on a patient; or
22	(3) Has been found guilty by a court of law of committing a sexual assault on a patient."
23	SECTION 2.
24	Said chapter is further amended in Article 2, relating to medical practice, by adding a new

25 Code section to read as follows:

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follows:

"43-34-47. (a) As used in this Code section, the term: (1) 'Health care professional' means: (A) A physician licensed to practice medicine under this chapter; (B) A registered nurse or practical nurse licensed under Chapter 26 of this title; or (C) A physician assistant licensed under this chapter. (2) 'Sexual assault' shall have the same meaning as in Code Section 15-24-1. (b) A health care professional shall report the name of a physician to the board if the health care professional has reasonable cause to believe that such physician has committed sexual assault on a patient. A health care professional shall not be required to duplicate a report if he or she has reasonable cause to believe that such report has been made to the board. A health care professional shall not be required to report a physician to the board under this Code section as a result of professional knowledge obtained in the course of the health care professional-patient relationship when the physician is the patient. (c) No health care professional required to report a physician to the board under this Code section who in good faith either reports or fails to report shall be subject to civil or criminal liability or discipline for unprofessional conduct for such action or inaction." **SECTION 3.** Chapter 34A of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to patient right to know, is amended by revising Code Section 43-34A-9, relating to annual report, as "43-34A-9. (a) As used in this Code section, the term: (1) 'Sexual abuse, misconduct, or exploitation' shall have the same meaning as in paragraph (15) of subsection (a) of Code Section 43-34-8. (2) 'Sexual assault' shall have the same meaning as in Code Section 15-24-1. (a)(b) On January 1 of each year, the board shall compile a report for the Governor and General Assembly containing a statistical and comparative data analysis using information obtained from the physician profiles in addition to other information collected by the board. The board shall not be required to distribute copies of the report to the Governor or members of the General Assembly but shall provide notification of the availability of the report in the manner which it deems to be the most effective and efficient. (b)(c) The report shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following information:

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- 59 (1) The number of physicians for which it has created physician profiles;
- (2) The specialty board certification of such physicians; 60
- 61 (3) The geographic regions of the primary practices;

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- 62 (4) The number of physicians participating in the Medicaid program; and
- (5) The number of physicians carrying any medical malpractice insurance and the
 specialty and current hospital privileges of the physicians not carrying such insurance and
 whether such physicians are actively seeing patients: and
- 66 (6) The number of physicians for which the board has conducted investigations for
- 67 committing an act of sexual assault, sexual abuse, misconduct, or exploitation of a
- 68 patient, and the outcome of the investigation which shall include whether it refused,
- 69 revoked, or suspended a license, or issued a private or public disciplinary order."
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SECTION 4.

71 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
