A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 60 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions applicable to counties and municipal corporations, so as to provide that
- 3 local governments treat fence detection systems as any other alarm system; to define fence
- 4 detection system; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

- 8 Chapter 60 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 9 provisions applicable to counties and municipal corporations, is amended by adding a new
- 10 Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>36-60-12.1.</u>
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'fence detection system' means a new or existing
- 13 <u>alarm system or electronic security system and ancillary components or equipment attached</u>
- 14 to such system that includes, but is not limited to:
- 15 (1) A fence, on commercial or industrial zoned property, surrounded by a nonelectric
- perimeter fence or wall that is at least five feet in height with conspicuous warning signs
- 17 that are located on the fence at no more than 40 foot intervals and that read:
- 18 <u>'WARNING-ELECTRIC FENCE';</u>
- 19 (2) An energizer powered by a commercial storage battery not exceeding 12 volts that
- 20 produces a short electric pulsed charge upon contact with the fence; and
- 21 (3) A battery charging device used exclusively to charge the battery
- 22 that interfaces with a monitored alarm device in a manner that enables the alarm system or
- 23 <u>electronic security system to transmit a signal intended to summon law enforcement or the</u>
- 24 property owner in response to an intrusion or burglary and produces an electric charge on
- 25 <u>contact that does not exceed energizer characteristics set for electric fence energizers by</u>
- 26 <u>the International Electrotechnical Commission Standard 60335-2-76:2018.</u>

27 (b) Each county, consolidated government, and municipal corporation shall treat fence

- detection systems, in all matters, as alarm systems as defined in paragraph (.1) of Code
- 29 <u>Section 43-14-2."</u>

30 **SECTION 2.**

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
