A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 8 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to theft, so as to provide for the crime of theft by possession of stolen mail; to
- 3 provide for the crime of porch piracy; to provide for definitions; to provide for penalties; to
- 4 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Article 1 of Chapter 8 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to theft,
- 8 is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 9 "16-8-24.
- 10 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Mail' means a letter, post card, package, bag, or other sealed article that:
- 12 (A) Is delivered by the United States Postal Service, a common carrier, or a delivery
- service and has not yet been received by the person to whom it is addressed; or
- 14 (B) Has been left in a location to be collected for delivery by the United States Postal
- 15 Service, a common carrier, or a delivery service.
- 16 (2) 'Possesses stolen mail' means to knowingly receive, retain, possess, conceal, or
- dispose of stolen mail knowing that it has been stolen and to withhold such stolen mail
- 18 <u>from the true owner or person to whom the mail is addressed or to appropriate such stolen</u>
- mail to the use of any person other than the true owner or the person to whom the mail
- is addressed.
- 21 (b) A person shall be guilty of the crime of theft by possession of stolen mail if he or she:
- 22 (1) Possesses stolen mail addressed to three or more different mailboxes or addresses;
- 23 <u>and</u>
- 24 (2) Possesses a minimum of ten separate pieces of stolen mail.

25 (c) A person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a felony and, upon

- 26 <u>conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than</u>
- 27 <u>five years.</u>
- 28 (d) Each set of ten separate pieces of stolen mail addressed to three or more different
- 29 <u>mailboxes or addresses constitutes a separate and distinct crime and may be punished</u>
- 30 <u>accordingly.</u>
- 31 (e) The fact that the person who stole the mail has not been convicted, apprehended, or
- 32 <u>identified shall not be a defense to the charge of theft by possession of stolen mail."</u>
- 33 SECTION 2.
- 34 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 35 "<u>16-8-25.</u>
- 36 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'dwelling' has the same meaning as provided in
- 37 <u>Code Section 16-7-1.</u>
- 38 (b) A person shall be guilty of the crime of porch piracy if such person takes, removes, or
- 39 <u>otherwise appropriates any envelope, bag, package, or other sealed article of another person</u>
- 40 <u>without the permission of such other person from the porch, steps, or immediate vicinity</u>
- 41 <u>of any entrance or exit of a dwelling.</u>
- 42 (c) A person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a felony and, upon
- 43 <u>conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than</u>
- 44 <u>five years.</u>"
- 45 SECTION 3.
- 46 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
