A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math
- 2 (STEM) Workforce for Georgia's Growing Economy; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the General Assembly strives to foster a robust workforce and thriving business
- 4 environment in this state; and
- 5 WHEREAS, it is in the state's best interest to examine its current practices, pilot programs,
- 6 and public-private partnerships and initiatives regarding workforce development across
- 7 Georgia; and
- 8 WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the value of all work while also giving focus to
- 9 Georgia's rich agricultural industry as well as the growth of medical, automobile,
- 10 cybersecurity, and other science based career development sectors of our growing economy;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, nearly 40 percent of Georgia's gross domestic product is due to fast growing
- 13 STEM related industries that employ over a third of the state's workforce; and

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14 WHEREAS, the growing STEM industries will quickly require a larger workforce that is

- 15 adequately educated and trained.
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 17 (1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House Study Committee
- on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Workforce for Georgia's Growing
- 19 Economy.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of fifteen members to be
- appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a
- member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.
- 23 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 26 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 27 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 30 (5) Allowances and funding.
- 31 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided for
- in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 33 (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
- or who are state employees shall receive no compensation for their service on the
- 35 committee, but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance
- of their duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed
- for expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.
- 38 (C) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than three days unless additional days are authorized. Funds

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necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House; except that funds for the reimbursement of expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and for the reimbursement of expenses of state employees shall come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

45 (6) **Report.**

- 46 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that 47 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the 48 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 50 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- 51 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of
- 52 this paragraph.
- 53 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 57 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 59 thereof.
- 60 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024.
