A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on the Economic Advantages of Marijuana
- 2 Legalization; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, at least 23 states, two territories, and the District of Columbia have legalized
- 4 small amounts of marijuana for adult recreational use, but Georgia is not one of them; and
- 5 WHEREAS, since its legalization eight years ago, Colorado marijuana sales have topped \$11
- 6 billion, with nearly \$2.2 billion in 2020 alone; the Arizona Department of Revenue estimates
- 7 nearly \$611 million in sales of both medical and recreational marijuana since its legalization;
- 8 and, in Nevada, taxable sales reached roughly \$912 million in 2021; and
- 9 WHEREAS, marijuana tax revenues are significant, exceeding cigarette and alcohol tax
- 10 collections in many states that have legalized marijuana; and
- WHEREAS, on average, marijuana tax revenues have represented about 0.36 percent of state
- budgets in the seven states that had programs in place for the full year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, in Georgia, state agencies lack resources to effectively monitor illegal
- 14 marijuana possession and sale; and

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15 WHEREAS, it is worth considering whether funds from legalization and taxation of

- 16 marijuana could be beneficial in contributing to its monitoring of proper use.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 18 (1) Creation of House study committee. There is created the House Study Committee
- on the Economic Advantages of Marijuana Legalization.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.
- 24 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- 25 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 27 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 28 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 31 (5) Allowances and funding. The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 32 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 33 Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.
- 37 (6) **Report.**
- 38 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the

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same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to 40 41 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for 42 proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) 44 of this paragraph.

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- 45 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 46 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- 47 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives. 48
- 49 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu 50 51 thereof.
- (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2024. 52
