

House Resolution 1410

A RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to waive the state's defense of sovereign
 2 immunity regarding actions of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia;
 3 to provide that such board shall be subject to an oversight panel; to provide for related
 4 matters; to provide for the submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for
 5 other purposes.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

8 Article VIII, Section IV of the Constitution is amended by adding new paragraphs to read as
 9 follows:

10 "Paragraph II. *Waiver of sovereign immunity.* The state's defense of sovereign
 11 immunity is hereby waived as to any action regarding the Board of Regents of the
 12 University System of Georgia.

13 Paragraph III. *Creation of oversight panel.* There shall be created an oversight panel
 14 of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia which shall consist of three
 15 members each to be appointed by the Governor, the Speaker of the House, and the
 16 President of the Senate and have such qualifications, powers, and duties as provided by
 17 law."

18 SECTION 2.

19 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as
 20 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the
 21 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:

22 "() YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to waive the state's
 23 defense of sovereign immunity regarding actions of the Board of Regents of
 24 the University System of Georgia and to create an oversight panel of such
 25 () NO board?"

- 26 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."
27 All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If
28 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall
29 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
