A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Motor Vehicle Crash Fatality Rates; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the number
- 4 of fatal traffic accidents on Georgia roads is increasing, with over 1,800 deaths in 2021; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia experienced a roughly 18 percent increase in motor vehicle
- 6 related fatalities between 2017 and 2021; and
- 7 WHEREAS, there was, approximately, a 3.8 percent increase in the number of deaths
- 8 reported on Georgia's highways between 2021 and 2022, a figure dramatically higher than
- 9 the average for the United States, which reported a 0.2 percent increase; and
- 10 WHEREAS, highway fatalities in Georgia reached the highest level in years despite an
- overall decrease in the number of drivers on the road due to the pandemic; and
- 12 WHEREAS, unsafe driving behaviors are the leading cause of death upon roads in this state;

14 WHEREAS, study is needed to examine Georgia's traffic fatalities and crashes, analyze

- 15 trends, and make comparisons to other states' motor vehicle crash fatality rates and laws to
- 16 determine if legislative action is warranted in this state.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 18 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Motor Vehicle Crash Fatality Rates.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- 21 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 22 Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson
- of the committee.
- 24 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- 25 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 27 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 28 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 31 (5) Allowances and funding.
- 32 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 34 (B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 46 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 47 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee. 48 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with 49 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 50 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 53 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2023.
