## A RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to revise a provision relating to filling of
 vacancies in the offices of Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School Superintendent,
 Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture, and Commissioner of Labor; to
 provide for related matters; to provide for submission of this amendment for ratification or
 rejection; and for other purposes.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

## **SECTION 1.**

Article V, Section II of the Constitution is amended by revising Paragraph VIII as follows:
"Paragraph VIII. *Filling vacancies.* (a) When any public office shall become vacant by
death, resignation, or otherwise, the Governor shall promptly fill such vacancy unless
otherwise provided by this Constitution or by law; and persons so appointed shall serve for
the unexpired term unless otherwise provided by this Constitution or by law.

(b) In case of the death or withdrawal of a person who received a majority of votes cast
in an election for elected to the office of Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School
Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture, or
Commissioner of Labor, the Governor elected at the same election, upon becoming
Governor, shall have the power to fill such office by appointing, subject to the confirmation

of the Senate, an individual to serve until the next general election and until a successor for
the balance of the unexpired term shall have been elected and qualified."

20 **SECTION 2.** 21 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as 22 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the 23 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following: 24 "() YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to revise a provision for 25 () NO filling vacancies in the offices of Secretary of State, Attorney General, State 26 School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of 27 Agriculture, and Commissioner of Labor so as to remove a reference to 28 majority of votes received?" 29 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes." All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If 30 31 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall

32 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
