A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending Reverend Dr. Al Sharpton on his outstanding public service;
- 2 and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Reverend Dr. Al Sharpton, a civil rights pioneer, radio host, TV personality,
- 4 and columnist, has long been recognized for his lifelong efforts to eliminate inequality and
- 5 for his deep personal commitment to the civil rights of the citizens of the nation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, throughout his career, Reverend Al Sharpton, who has become known as the
- 7 "voice of the downtrodden," has challenged the American political establishment to include
- 8 all people regardless of race, gender, socio-economic status, or beliefs, and his oratory skills
- 9 have served as an impetus for change; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Rev. Al Sharpton, born on October 3, 1954, in Brooklyn, New York, began his
- 11 ministry at the age of four, preaching his first sermon at Washington Temple Church of God
- 12 and Christ; and
- 13 WHEREAS, at the age of 13, Reverend Jesse Jackson and Reverend William Jones
- 14 appointed him youth director of New York's SCLC Operation Breadbasket, an organization
- 15 founded by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and
- 16 WHEREAS, he founded the National Youth Movement at the age of 16, organizing young
- 17 people around the country to push for increased voter registration, cultural awareness, and
- 18 job training programs; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Reverend Al Sharpton's direct action movements have been credited with
- 20 drawing attention to racial injustice and racial profiling, and he has influenced police
- 21 department reform across the nation; and

22 WHEREAS, he has also been at the vanguard of issues promoting equal standards and

- 23 decency, holding people accountable for perpetrating negative and racist stereotypes; and he
- 24 has been successful in getting the private sector to engage in contracts with minority
- communities, taking him "from the streets to the suites"; and
- 26 WHEREAS, one of his career highlights has been contributing to the end of the United States
- 27 Navy exercises in Vieques, Puerto Rico, showing his passion for confronting human rights
- 28 violations; and he is also a leader on issues regarding educational equality in the US; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Reverend Al Sharpton is the founder and president of the National Action
- 30 Network, a nonprofit civil rights organization that has become the most active social justice
- 31 organization in the country; and
- WHEREAS, the organization led the nationwide campaign for voter engagement, national
- 33 gun violence intervention, and healthcare reform; and
- 34 WHEREAS, he is currently the host of a television show on MSNBC that analyzes the top
- 35 political and social news of the day and features the country's leading news makers; and
- 36 WHEREAS, Reverend Al Sharpton was educated in New York public schools and attended
- 37 Brooklyn College, and he also has an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from
- 38 Bethune-Cookman University and Virginia Union University and an honorary degree from
- 39 A.P. Bible College; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Reverend Al Sharpton has had an irrefutable impact on national politics and
- 41 civil rights because of his strong commitment to equality and progressive politics, and it is
- 42 abundantly fitting and proper that he be recognized.
- 43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 44 the members of this body recognize and commend Reverend Dr. Al Sharpton for the
- 45 tremendous contributions he has made to the nation.
- 46 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 47 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Reverend Dr. Al Sharpton.
