A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on the Insurance Review of Erectile Dysfunction; and
- 2 for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the effects of Viagra can cause a side effect called priapism, which is when an
- 4 erection has the ability to last for a long period of time and become very painful; and
- 5 WHEREAS, recreational use of erectile dysfunction medication (Viagra) has been linked to
- 6 "increased sexual behaviors, increased risk for sexually transmitted infections, including
- 7 incident HIV infection," according to a 2011 study conducted by The University of Texas
- 8 at Austin; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Viagra is a PDE5 inhibitor which in turn can cause vasodilation (low blood
- 10 pressure), having the ability to decrease blood flow to the optic nerve; and
- 11 WHEREAS, sildenafil (Viagra) is one of the most widely used drugs in the world. It can
- 12 cause psychological addiction and dependent behavior due to the fact that men may seek it
- 13 to overcome performance anxiety issues. Also, the influence of pornography may pressure
- men to emulate the performances seen in porn films; and
- 15 WHEREAS, pornography has potential detrimental effects on the user, such as emotional,
- 16 mental, and medical illnesses, shaping deviant sexual arousal, difficulty forming or
- 17 maintaining intimate relationships, brain development and functioning, problematic or
- 18 harmful sexual behaviors, and addiction; and
- 19 WHEREAS, withdrawal symptoms from Viagra can potentially be HIV or hepatitis (under
- 20 the impact of Viagra, people typically have unprotected sex which can lead to exposure to
- 21 those diseases), depression, vision problems, and sensorineural hearing loss, causing damage
- 22 to inner ear structures and possibly leading to permanent hearing loss. The peer reviewed
- 23 scholarly journal, *The Laryngoscope*, reported that in "Forty-seven cases of sensorineural

24 hearing loss with a temporal association with PDE-5 inhibitor[s]...sildenafil accounted for

- 25 50% of cases"; and
- 26 WHEREAS, several major lifestyle factors have been identified as contributing to the onset
- of erectile dysfunction, such as smoking, alcohol consumption, and obesity; and
- WHEREAS, psychological factors have been shown to have strong correlation to the onset
- 29 of erectile dysfunction; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the cessation of smoking has been demonstrated to resolve erectile dysfunction
- 31 in roughly 25 percent of patients; and
- 32 WHEREAS, heavy alcohol consumption is understood to be a significant contributing factor
- 33 to the need for erectile dysfunction treatment; and
- 34 WHEREAS, these lifestyle factors are the responsibility of the individual and not the state
- 35 health benefit plan; and
- 36 WHEREAS, erectile dysfunction treatment places a burden upon Georgia's taxpayers for a
- 37 medically unnecessary treatment.
- 38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 39 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on the Insurance Review of Erectile Dysfunction.
- 41 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of six female members
- of the House of Representatives. Two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the
- House of Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the chairperson of the
- House Committee on Insurance, one member shall be appointed by the Majority Leader,
- and one member shall be appointed by the Minority Leader. The Speaker shall designate
- a member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.
- 47 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 50 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 52 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

(5) Allowances and funding.

(A) Members of the committee who are members of the General Assembly shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives.

- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 70 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 74 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 77 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2019.
