A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Congress to enact legislation placing a moratorium on negative
- 2 credit reporting during the COVID-19 pandemic; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia faces an unprecedented public health crisis due to the
- 4 COVID-19 pandemic; and
- 5 WHEREAS, there have already been more than 552,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in
- 6 the state and that number is expected to continue to climb higher; and
- 7 WHEREAS, COVID-19 has caused considerable financial hardship to employees who have
- 8 been laid off or furloughed or are working reduced hours and to business owners who have
- 9 seen a considerable reduction in income; and
- 10 WHEREAS, financial hardships are causing many individuals to struggle to pay their bills,
- including credit card debt, interest payments, and student loans; and
- 12 WHEREAS, many Georgians have lost their jobs through no fault of their own, have not
- 13 received unemployment benefits, and have been denied benefits in the Department of Labor

15 WHEREAS, this has caused considerable financial disruptions to the economic stability of

- 16 individuals, families, and businesses and negatively impacts the ability to secure current and
- 17 future housing, transportation, employment, and higher education loans; and
- 18 WHEREAS, suspending credit downgrades and removing other negative impacts on personal
- 19 and business credit reporting from March 2020 through the duration of the COVID-19
- 20 pandemic will extend grace and help individuals and businesses impacted by the pandemic.
- 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 22 the members of this body urge the United States Congress to enact legislation placing a
- 23 moratorium on negative credit reporting and suspending credit downgrades and removing
- 24 other negative impacts on personal and business credit reports during the COVID-19
- 25 pandemic.
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- 27 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 28 members of the Georgia congressional delegation.
