- 1 Commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall Inn Movement; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, on June 28, 1969, the Stonewall Inn became the birthplace for equal dignity and
- 4 freedom for millions of oppressed and marginalized Americans around the country; and
- 5 WHEREAS, those who took a stand for human rights and dignity at the Stonewall Inn were
- 6 pioneers of the LGBTQ movement, including two transgender women of color, Sylvia Rivera
- 7 and Marsha P. Johnson; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the courage and conviction of those who stood for the freedom and liberation
- 9 of the oppressed and marginalized inspired countless others to do the same, leading to the
- 10 formation of the first LGBTQ organizations in the United States; and
- 11 WHEREAS, during the past 50 years, the United States has made great strides toward
- 12 ensuring the equal rights and dignity of LGBTQ Americans, which include the right to
- privacy, the freedom from discrimination, and the right to marry; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the LGBTQ community will come together in solidarity to mark the 50th
- anniversary of the Stonewall Inn Movement in 2019 to celebrate the progress we have made
- and acknowledge the work that still remains to be done to live up to our founding principles
- 17 that all Americans are created equal.
- 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 19 the members of this body commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall Inn
- 20 Movement and recognize that LGBTQ rights are human rights.
