## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Diane Larché; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Diane Larché on Friday, January 12, 2024; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Diane Larché was born on April 9, 1958, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, a  
5 beloved daughter of Fred and Catherine Powell; and
- 6 WHEREAS, she was always dedicated to making a difference and made a great impact with  
7 her early career in journalism and later as a public relations specialist; and
- 8 WHEREAS, her professional accolades and volunteer efforts are too numerous to mention;  
9 however it should be noted that she was the founding and current president of the Greater  
10 Atlanta Section of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW), the largest section ever  
11 to be chartered in the 83 year history of NCNW; and
- 12 WHEREAS, she was a member of the Gamma Rho chapter of the Gamma Sigma Sigma  
13 National Service Sorority and of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc; and

14 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, she was an active member of Ben Hill  
15 United Methodist Church; and

16 WHEREAS, she was united in love and marriage to her husband, Joe; and

17 WHEREAS, she gave inspiration to many through her high ideals, morals, and deep concern  
18 for her fellow citizens, and the devotion, patience, and understanding she demonstrated to  
19 her family and friends were admired by others; and

20 WHEREAS, she was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
21 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness, and by the example she made of her life,  
22 she made this world a better place in which to live; and

23 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous woman, Diane Larché will long be remembered  
24 for her love of family, friendship, and community and will be missed by all who had the  
25 great fortune of knowing her.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
27 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Diane Larché and express  
28 their deepest and most sincere regret at her passing.
