Senate Bill 249 By: Senator Albers of the 56th

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Chapter 17 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
2	Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund, so as to increase the amount of monthly dues paid
3	by members of the fund; to revise amounts collected from certain fines and forfeitures in
4	criminal and quasi-criminal cases; to increase the monthly benefit allowed upon retirement;
5	to provide for related matters; to provide conditions for an effective date and automatic
6	repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
8	SECTION 1.
9	Chapter 17 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Peace
10	Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund, is amended by revising subsection (a) of Code
11	Section 47-17-44, relating to amount of dues, deadline and minimum period for payments,
12	dues required for credit for service after March 1, 1951, and dues required for prior service
13	credit, as follows:
14	"(a)(1) Each member shall pay into the fund as dues the sum of $\frac{20.00 \pm 25.00}{25.00}$ per month.
15	(2) On and after July 1, 2021, each member shall pay into the fund as dues a monthly
16	amount to be determined annually by the board that shall be at least \$25.00, but shall not
17	exceed \$30.00. The board shall determine the monthly dues amount based on:
18	(A) The recommendation of the actuary of the board;
19	(B) The maintenance of the actuarial soundness of the fund in accordance with the
20	standards provided in Code Section 47-20-10 or such higher standards as may be
21	adopted by the board; and
22	(C) Such other factors as the board declares relevant.
23	(3) Each month's dues shall be paid not later than the tenth day of that month.
24	(4) Each member shall be required to pay such dues for a minimum period of ten years,
25	or 15 years for individuals who became members on or after July 1, 2010, before being
26	eligible to receive the retirement benefits under this chapter, provided that, if such

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27 member is eligible to retire under this chapter and so desires, such member may retire,

and the board shall deduct such monthly amount from his or her retirement benefits until

29 he or she has paid dues into the fund for a period of ten years or 15 years for individuals

30 who became members on or after July 1, 2010."

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SECTION 2.

Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 47-17-60, relating
to payments to the fund from fines and bonds collected in criminal and quasi-criminal cases,
duty of collecting authority to record and remit sums collected, and penalty, as follows:

duty of collecting authority to record and remit sums collected, and penalty, as follows:
"(a) A portion of each fine collected and each bond forfeited and collected in any criminal
or quasi-criminal case for violation of state statutes, county ordinances, or municipal
ordinances, which case is before any court or tribunal in this state, shall be paid to the
secretary-treasurer according to the following schedule:

39 (1) Three <u>Seven</u> dollars for any fine or bond forfeiture of more than \$4.00, but not more
40 than \$25.00;

41 (2) Four Eight dollars for any fine or bond forfeiture of more than \$25.00, but not more
42 than \$50.00;

43 (3) Five Nine dollars for any fine or bond forfeiture of more than \$50.00, but not more
44 than \$100.00; or

45 (4) Five Eight percent of any fine or bond forfeiture of more than \$100.00.

46 For purposes of determining amounts to be paid to the secretary-treasurer, the amount of 47 the fine or bond collected shall be deemed to include costs. The amounts provided for shall 48 be paid to the secretary-treasurer before the payment of any costs or any claim whatsoever against such fine or forfeiture. The collecting authority shall pay such amounts to the 49 50 secretary-treasurer on the first day of the month following that in which they were collected 51 or at such other time as the board may provide. With such payment there shall be filed an 52 acceptable form which shows the number of cases in each of the above categories and the amounts due in each category. It shall be the duty of the collecting authority to keep 53 54 accurate records of the amounts due the board so that the records may be audited or inspected at any time by any representative of the board under its direction. Sums remitted 55 to the secretary-treasurer under this Code section shall be used as provided for elsewhere 56 57 in this chapter."

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SECTION 3.

59 Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 47-17-80, relating
60 to retirement benefit options, payment to surviving spouse, requirements, effect of

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- 61 reemployment, effect of change in retirement benefits, and payment on death of member, as
- 62 follows:

63 "(b)(1) Option One shall consist of a single life annuity payable in monthly payments for 64 the life of the member only. The monthly payment under this option shall be an amount equal to \$17.50 \$35.00 per month for each full year of creditable service and in the event 65 the member shall have additional service credit not totaling a full year, the further sum 66 67 of one-twelfth of the amount paid per month for each additional year of service credit shall be paid for each month of additional service credit, provided that the member either 68 69 has at least ten years of membership service, or 15 years for members who become 70 individuals who became members on or after July 1, 2010, and is at least 55 years of age 71 or has at least 30 years of creditable service, regardless of age. Such monthly benefit 72 payment shall be paid on each full year and additional full months of creditable service up to a maximum of 30 years of total service. 73

- No member shall be eligible for benefits under this option until the member's official
 duties as a peace officer have been terminated, except as otherwise provided in this
 chapter, and unless the member files an application for retirement benefits within 90 days
 from the date of the termination of the member's official duties as a peace officer, unless
 prevented therefrom for good cause.
- (3) If such member shall qualify for retirement benefits in every respect except for
 completion of payment of monthly dues for the periods of time for which the member has
 received service credit, dues shall be deducted from the member's monthly benefit check
 until such dues have been paid in full.

Any member who has at least ten years of membership service, or 15 years for members who become individuals who became members on or after July 1, 2010, for which dues have been fully paid but who has not reached 55 years of age may cease paying monthly dues into the fund if the member's employment as a peace officer is terminated; and upon reaching 55 years of age the member may be eligible to receive retirement benefits under this option."

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SECTION 4.

90 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2020, only if it is determined to have been 91 concurrently funded as provided in Chapter 20 of Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia 92 Annotated, the "Public Retirement Systems Standards Law"; otherwise, this Act shall not 93 become effective and shall be automatically repealed in its entirety on July 1, 2020, as 94 required by subsection (a) of Code Section 47-20-50. 95

96 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
