A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 8 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 employment and training of peace officers, so as to provide for re-employment of retired 3 peace officers and correctional officers during disasters and emergencies; to provide 4 definitions; to provide for training and qualifications; to provide for immunities and powers 5 of arrest; to provide for compensation; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting 6 laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

9 Chapter 8 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to employment and

10 training of peace officers, is amended by adding new paragraphs to Code Section 35-8-2, 11 relating to definitions, to read as follows:

- 12 "(8.1) 'Requesting entity' means any law enforcement agency or other entity within this 13 state empowered by law to maintain a law enforcement unit.
- 14 (8.2) 'Retired correctional officer' means any retired correctional officer certified by the
- 15 council."
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SECTION 2.

17 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 18 "<u>35-8-21.1.</u>
- 19 (a) Any law enforcement unit in this state may supplement its workforce as necessary with
- 20 qualified, retired peace officers or correctional officers when a disaster or emergency has
- been declared by a county sheriff, a public safety director, or the Governor or when there 21
- 22 is a national emergency.
- 23 (b) Retired peace officers and retired correctional officers assisting law enforcement units
- 24 under the provisions of this Code section shall be in compliance with the annual training
- 25 and qualification standards for peace officers established under this chapter.

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- 26 (c) Any retired peace officer or retired correctional officer assisting the requesting entity
- 27 shall have the same immunities and powers of arrest as he or she has in his or her own
- 28 jurisdiction, and the same powers of arrest as officers of the requesting entity, including
- 29 sovereign immunity, official immunity, and the public duty doctrine, for the duration of the
- 30 declared disaster or emergency. Such powers shall be limited to the location where the
- 31 retired officer's services are requested to be provided, for the duration of the specific event,
- 32 and while acting under the direction of the requesting entity's chief law enforcement officer
- 33 <u>or his or her designee.</u>
- 34 (d) Any retired peace officer or correctional officer assisting a requesting entity shall be
- 35 deemed an employee of the requesting entity for the duration of the declared disaster or
- 36 <u>emergency and shall be subject to the workers' compensation, overtime, and expense</u>
- 37 reimbursement provisions provided to him or her as an employee of the requesting entity.
- 38 (e) Any compensation awarded to retirees for service under this Code section shall be paid
- 39 <u>by the requesting entity.</u>
- 40 (f) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to limit the powers of arrest provided
- 41 to a law enforcement officer by any other law."

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SECTION 3.

43 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
