A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 3 and Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 25 of the Official Code
- 2 of Georgia Annotated, relating to minimum requirements for local fire departments and
- 3 general provisions relative to firefighter standards and training, respectively, so as to provide
- 4 for procedures for organization, issuance and revocation of certificates of compliance,
- 5 requirements, and training and standards of fire departments and volunteer fire departments;
- 6 to provide for a definition; to establish the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council; to
- 7 provide for membership, functions, powers, and meetings for such council; to provide for
- 8 administrative assignment; to provide for qualifications for volunteer firefighters; to provide
- 9 for basic training and certificates for volunteer firefighters; to amend Code Section 45-9-101
- 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions relative to the temporary
- 11 disability compensation program, so as to revise a definition; for related matters; to repeal
- 12 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

14 SECTION 1.

- 15 Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Title 25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 16 minimum requirements for local fire departments, is amended by revising Code Section
- 17 25-3-22, relating to notification and documentation that organization meets requirements and
- 18 issuance of certificate of compliance, as follows:
- 19 "25-3-22.

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- 20 (a) In order for a fire department employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters
- 21 to be legally organized to operate in the State of Georgia, the chief administrative officer
- of the fire department shall notify and submit all required documentation to the executive
- 23 director that demonstrates that the organization meets the minimum requirements specified
- in Code Section 25-3-23 and the rules and regulations of the Georgia Firefighter Standards
- 25 and Training Council to function as a fire department. If the executive director is satisfied
- 26 that the fire department meets the minimum requirements contained in Code Section

27 25-3-23 and the rules and regulations of the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, he or she shall recommend to the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training 28 29 Council that a certificate of compliance be issued by the council to the fire department. If the council issues such certificate of compliance, the fire department shall be authorized 30 31 to exercise the general and emergency powers set forth in Code Sections 25-3-1 and 32 25-3-2. 33 (b) In order for a volunteer fire department to be legally organized to operate in the State of Georgia, the chief administrative officer of the fire department shall notify and submit 34 35 all required documentation to the executive director that demonstrates that the organization meets the minimum requirements specified in Code Section 25-3-23 and the rules and 36 37 regulations of the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council to function as a volunteer fire 38 department. If the executive director is satisfied that the volunteer fire department meets the minimum requirements contained in Code Section 25-3-23 and the rules and 39 40 regulations of the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, he or she shall recommend to the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council that a certificate of compliance be issued by 41 42 such council to the volunteer fire department. If the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service 43 Council issues such certificate of compliance, the fire department shall be authorized to exercise the general and emergency powers set forth in Code Sections 25-3-1 and 25-3-2." 44

45 SECTION 2.

46 Said article is further amended in Code Section 25-3-23, relating to general requirements,

47 equipment and clothing, and insurance, by revising subsections (a) and (c) as follows:

48 "(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of this Code section, in order to be

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50 (1) A fire department shall comply with the following requirements:

(A) Be established to provide fire and other emergency and nonemergency services in accordance with standards specified solely by the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, for fire departments employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, for fire departments solely

utilizing volunteer firefighters, and the applicable local government;

(B) Be capable of providing fire protection 24 hours a day, 365 days per year;

(C) Be responsible for a defined area of operations depicted on a map located at the fire station, which area of operations shall have been approved and designated by the governing authority of the applicable county, municipality, or other political subdivision in the case of any county, municipal, or volunteer fire department; and (D) Be staffed with a sufficient number of full-time, part-time, or volunteer firefighters

who have successfully completed basic firefighter training as specified by the Georgia

Firefighter Standards and Training Council, for fire departments employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, for

- 65 <u>fire departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters</u>; and
- 66 (2) A fire department shall possess the following items of approved equipment and
- protective clothing:
- (A) A minimum of one fully equipped, operable pumper with a capacity of at least 750
- 69 GPM at 150 PSI and a tank capacity of a minimum of 250 gallons; provided, however,
- that previously approved fire apparatus which does not meet such minimum standards
- may be used in lieu of the minimum required pumper until replaced by the local
- authority;
- 73 (B) A minimum of equipment, appliances, adapters, and accessories necessary to
- perform and carry out the duties and responsibilities of a fire department set forth in
- Code Sections 25-3-1 and 25-3-2 as approved by the Georgia Firefighter Standards and
- 76 Training Council, for fire departments employing full-time firefighters or part-time
- firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, for fire departments solely
- 78 <u>utilizing volunteer firefighters;</u>"
- 79 (C) A minimum of two approved self-contained breathing apparatus for each pumping
- apparatus as approved by the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, for
- 81 <u>fire departments employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the</u>
- 82 Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, for fire departments solely utilizing volunteer
- 83 <u>firefighters</u>; and
- 84 (D) A minimum issue of sufficient personal protective clothing to permit each member
- to perform safely the duties of a firefighter."
- 86 "(c)(1) The Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council shall be authorized to
- adopt such rules and regulations for fire departments employing full-time firefighters or
- 88 <u>part-time firefighters</u> as are reasonable and necessary to implement the provisions of this
- 89 Code section and to establish and modify minimum requirements for all fire departments
- operating in this state, provided that such requirements are equal to or exceed the
- 91 requirements provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this Code section.
- 92 (2) The Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council shall be authorized to adopt such rules
- 93 and regulations for fire departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters as are
- 94 reasonable and necessary to implement the provisions of this Code section and to
- 95 establish and modify minimum requirements for all volunteer fire departments operating
- 96 in this state, provided that such requirements are equal to or exceed the requirements
- provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this Code section."

98 SECTION 3.

99 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 24-3-25, relating to suspension or 100 revocation of certificate of compliance, hearing by aggrieved departments, and enforcement 101 of suspensions or revocations, as follows:

- 103 (a) The certificate of compliance issued by the council <u>Georgia Firefighter Standards and</u>
- 104 <u>Training Council or the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council</u> shall be subject to
- suspension or revocation by the <u>applicable</u> council at any time it receives satisfactory
- evidence that the fire department is not maintaining sufficient personnel, equipment, or
- insurance required by Code Section 25-3-23, or the rules and regulations of the Georgia
- 108 Firefighter Standards and Training Council, for fire departments employing full-time
- 109 <u>firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council, for fire</u>
- departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters, pursuant to subsection (c) of Code

- 112 (b) The chief administrative officer of any fire department aggrieved by a decision of the
- 113 council Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, for fire departments
- employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire
- 115 Service Council, for fire departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters, under
- subsection (a) of this Code section may, within 30 days of the date of such decision,
- request a hearing on the matter before the <u>applicable</u> council. Following a hearing before
- the applicable council, the chief administrative officer of the fire department affected shall
- be served with a written decision of the applicable council announcing whether the
- 120 certificate of compliance shall remain revoked or suspended or whether it shall be
- 121 reinstated.
- 122 (c) The council Georgia Firefighters Standards and Training Council, for fire departments
- employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire
- 124 Service Council, for fire departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters, shall not
- suspend or revoke any certificate of compliance for failure to meet firefighter training
- 126 requirements when such failure was due to unavailability of required training from or
- through the Georgia Fire Academy.
- 128 (d) The council Georgia Firefighters Standards and Training Council, for fire departments
- employing full-time firefighters or part-time firefighters, or the Georgia Volunteer Fire
- 130 Service Council, for fire departments solely utilizing volunteer firefighters, may refer
- suspensions or revocations to the Attorney General for enforcement. Upon referral from
- 132 the a council, the Attorney General may bring a civil action to enjoin any organization
- which is not in compliance with the applicable requirements of this chapter from

performing any or all firefighting functions until such requirements are met by such

135 organization."

136 **SECTION 4.**

- 137 Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 25 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 138 general provisions relative to firefighter standards and training, is amended in Code Section
- 139 25-4-2, relating to definitions, by revising paragraph (9) and adding a new paragraph to read
- 140 as follows:
- 141 "(9) 'Volunteer' means not employed for compensation by on an hourly or salaried basis,
- but appointed and regularly enrolled to serve as a firefighter for any municipal, county,
- state, or private incorporated fire department.
- 144 (10) 'Volunteer council' means the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council established by
- 145 <u>Code Section 25-4-3.1.</u>"

SECTION 5.

- 147 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 148 "<u>25-4-3.1.</u>
- 149 (a) There is established the Georgia Volunteer Fire Service Council which shall serve as
- a division of the council. The volunteer council shall possess all powers, rights, and duties
- as set forth by this article and shall not be considered an advisory committee as set forth
- in subsection (e) of Code Section 25-4-3. The volunteer council shall be composed of
- 153 seven members, all of which shall be members of volunteer fire departments that are
- otherwise not participants in the paid fire service unless in the capacity as a paid local fire
- chief in a jurisdiction with all volunteer firefighters. Two members shall be appointed by
- the Lieutenant Governor. Two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House
- of Representatives. The remaining three members shall be appointed by the Governor.
- 158 (b) The members of the volunteer council appointed by the Governor pursuant to
- subsection (a) of this Code section shall be appointed at the sole discretion of the Governor;
- provided, however, that the Governor may consider for such appointments persons
- suggested for membership thereon as follows:
- (1) The Association County Commissioners of Georgia may suggest the names of three
- persons;
- 164 (2) The Georgia Municipal Association may suggest the names of three persons;
- 165 (3) The Georgia Association of Fire Chiefs may suggest the names of three persons; and
- 166 (4) The Executive Board of the Georgia State Firefighters Association may suggest the
- names of three persons.

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(c)(1) The first members of the volunteer council appointed pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code section shall be appointed to take office on January 1, 2021. The two members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor shall be appointed for initial terms of one year, the two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be appointed for initial terms of two years, and the three members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for initial terms of three years. Thereafter, successors shall be appointed for terms of three years as their respective terms of office expire. (2) All members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the membership of the volunteer council for any reason, including ceasing to meet the qualifications required pursuant subsection (a) of this Code section, the Governor shall fill such vacancy for the unexpired term; provided, however, that a vacancy in those members of the volunteer council appointed by the Lieutenant Governor or the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment. In order for the Governor to consider the names of persons suggested for membership on the volunteer council pursuant to subsection (b) of this Code section, such names must be submitted to the Governor by the respective organizations at least 60 days but not more than 90 days prior to the expiration of the respective terms of office or prior to the appointment of the initial members of the volunteer council who take office on January 1, 2021. The Governor shall be authorized, but not required, to request the appropriate organization designated in subsection (b) of this Code section to suggest the names of three persons for the Governor's consideration in making an appointment to fill a vacancy. (d) At the first regular meeting of the volunteer council held in each odd-numbered year, the volunteer council shall elect a chairperson and such other officers from its own membership as it deems necessary to serve until successors are elected by the volunteer council as provided in this Code section. (e) The volunteer council may, from time to time, designate an advisory committee to assist and advise the volunteer council in carrying out its duties under this article. The members of any such advisory committee shall serve at the pleasure of the volunteer council. (f) Each member of the volunteer council and each member of an advisory committee of the volunteer council, in carrying out their official duties, shall be entitled to receive the same expense and mileage allowance authorized for members of professional licensing boards by subsection (f) of Code Section 43-1-2. The funds for such expenses and allowances shall be paid from funds appropriated or available to the Department of Public Safety."

205 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 25-4-4, relating to eligibility of

- 214 assignment to Department of Public Safety, source of funds, and authority to accept gifts by
- 215 the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, as follows:

- 217 The council is and volunteer council are assigned to the Department of Public Safety for
- administrative purposes. The funds necessary to carry out this chapter shall come from
- funds appropriated to and available to the council and volunteer council and from any other
- available funds. The council is and volunteer council are authorized to accept and use gifts,
- grants, and donations for the purpose of carrying out this chapter. The council is and
- 222 <u>volunteer council are</u> also authorized to accept and use property, both real and personal,
- and services for the purpose of carrying out this chapter article."
- SECTION 8.
- 225 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 25-4-6, relating to meetings,
- 226 quorum, and annual report by the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, as
- 227 follows:
- 228 "25-4-6.
- 229 (a) The business of the council shall be conducted in the following manner:
- 230 (1) The council shall hold at least two regular meetings each year at the call of the
- chairperson or upon the written request of six members of the council. Six members of
- the council shall constitute a quorum. The council shall adopt such rules for the
- transaction of its business as it shall desire and may appoint such committees as it
- considers necessary to carry out its business and duties; and
- 235 (2) The council shall make an annual report of its activities to the Governor and to the
- General Assembly and shall include in the report its recommendations for appropriate
- legislation. The council shall not be required to distribute copies of the annual report to

the members of the General Assembly but shall notify the members of the availability of the report in the manner which it deems to be most effective and efficient.

- 254 powers of the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council, as follows:

- 258 (2) To provide rules of procedure for its internal management and control;

- 271 (6) To approve institutions and facilities for school operation by or for any employing
- agency for the specific purpose of training <u>full-time</u> and <u>part-time</u> firefighters and
- 273 <u>full-time and part-time</u> firefighter recruits, including airport firefighters;

274 (7) To make or support studies on any aspect of fire-fighting firefighter education and

- training or recruitment;
- 276 (8) To make recommendations concerning any matter within its purview;
- 277 (9) To establish basic firefighter training requirements for full-time, part-time, and
- contract, and volunteer firefighters, including airport firefighters;
- 279 (10) To certify any person satisfactorily complying with the training program established
- in accordance with paragraph (9) of this Code section subsection and the qualifications
- for employment covered in this chapter; and
- 282 (11) To issue a certificate to any person who has received training in another state or
- 283 who has received training as a federal firefighter by the United States government, when
- 284 the council has determined that the training was at least equivalent to that required by the
- council for approved firefighter education and training programs in this state and when
- the person has satisfactorily complied with all other requirements of this chapter.
- 287 (b) The volunteer council is vested with the following functions and powers:
- 288 (1) To promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of the volunteer council;
- 289 (2) To provide rules of procedure for its internal management and control;
- 290 (3) To enter into contracts or do such things as may be necessary and incidental to the
- 291 <u>administration of its authority pursuant to this chapter;</u>
- 292 (4) To establish uniform minimum standards for the training of volunteer firefighters,
- 293 <u>including qualifications, certifications, and requirements, which are consistent with this</u>
- 294 <u>chapter</u>;
- 295 (5) To make or support studies on any aspect of firefighter education and training or
- 296 <u>recruitment;</u>
- 297 (6) To make recommendations concerning any matter within its purview;
- 298 (7) To establish basic firefighter training requirements for volunteer firefighters;
- 299 (8) To certify any person satisfactorily complying with the training program established
- in accordance with paragraph (7) of this subsection and the qualifications for serving as
- 301 <u>a volunteer firefighter covered in this chapter; and</u>
- 302 (9) To issue a certificate to any person who has received training in another state or who
- has received training as a federal firefighter by the United States government, when the
- 304 <u>volunteer council has determined that the training was at least equivalent to that required</u>
- 305 by the volunteer council for approved volunteer firefighter education and training
- 306 programs in this state and when the person has satisfactorily complied with all other
- 307 <u>requirements of this chapter.</u>
- 308 (c) All rules and regulations promulgated by the volunteer council may be overturned by
- 309 <u>a two-thirds' vote of the council. In such instance, the rule or regulation shall be returned</u>
- 310 to the volunteer council for reconsideration."

311 **SECTION 10.**

312 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 25-4-7.1, relating to appointment

- 313 and compensation of executive director and assistants, as follows:
- 314 "25-4-7.1.
- 315 (a) The council, in conjunction with the volunteer council, shall appoint and establish the
- 316 compensation of an executive director who shall serve at the pleasure of the council.
- 317 (b) The executive director may contract for such services and employ such other
- professional, technical, and clerical personnel as may be necessary and convenient to carry
- out the purposes of this chapter.
- 320 (c) The executive director shall provide the same services in support of the volunteer
- 321 <u>council as provided to the council.</u>
- 322 (d) The executive director shall bring all issues involving volunteer firefighters and
- 323 volunteer fire departments to the volunteer council."
- 324 **SECTION 11.**
- 325 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 326 "<u>24-5-8.1.</u>
- 327 (a) Except as otherwise provided in Code Section 25-4-12, any person volunteering at a
- 328 <u>volunteer fire department as a volunteer firefighter shall, as prescribed by the volunteer</u>
- 329 council:
- 330 (1) Be at least 18 years of age;
- 331 (2) Not have been convicted of, or pleaded guilty to, a felony in any jurisdiction or of a
- crime which if committed in this state would constitute a felony under the laws of this
- 333 state within ten years prior to volunteering, provided that a person who has been
- 334 <u>convicted of a felony more than five but less than ten years prior to volunteering may be</u>
- registered as a volunteer firefighter when the person has:
- 336 (A) Successfully completed a training program following the Georgia Fire Academy
- 337 <u>curriculum and sponsored by the Department of Corrections</u>;
- 338 (B) Been recommended to a volunteer fire department by the proper authorities at the
- institution at which the training program was undertaken; and
- 340 (C) Met all other requirements for a volunteer firefighter as set forth in this chapter.
- 341 (b) For the purposes of this Code section, a person shall be deemed to have been convicted
- of a crime if such person shall have pleaded guilty to a charge thereof before a court or
- 343 <u>federal magistrate or shall have been found guilty thereof by the decision or judgment of</u>
- 344 <u>a court or federal magistrate or by the verdict of a jury, irrespective of the pronouncement</u>
- of sentence or the suspension thereof, unless such plea of guilty or such decision, judgment,
- or verdict shall have been set aside, reversed, or otherwise abrogated by lawful judicial

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process or unless the person convicted of the crime shall have received a pardon therefor 348 from the President of the United States or the governor or other pardoning authority in the 349 jurisdiction where the conviction was had or shall have received a certificate of good 350 conduct granted by the State Board of Pardons and Paroles pursuant to the provisions of law to remove a disability under law because of such conviction. Any person convicted 351 352 of a felony while he or she is a registered volunteer firefighter shall have his or her 353 registration revoked. 354 (c)(1) For purposes of making determinations relating to eligibility under this Code 355 section, a local volunteer fire department shall provide information relative to prospective 356 volunteers to the local law enforcement agency or other agency having access to the 357 Georgia Crime Information Center for a search to determine if the prospective volunteer 358 has been convicted of a felony in Georgia. Such local agency shall be authorized to 359 obtain conviction data with respect to such prospective volunteers of a local volunteer fire department as authorized in this subsection. All conviction data received by the local 360 361 agency shall not be a public record, shall be privileged, and shall not be disclosed to any 362 other person or agency except as provided in this subsection and except to any person or agency which otherwise has a legal right to inspect the file. All such records shall be 363 364 maintained by the local agency pursuant to laws regarding such records and the rules and 365 regulations of the Georgia Crime Information Center, as applicable. As used in this subsection, 'conviction data' means a record of a finding or verdict of guilty or plea of 366 367 guilty or plea of nolo contendere with regard to any crime, regardless of whether an 368 appeal of the conviction has been sought. 369 (2) The volunteer council shall create a form upon which may be indicated only whether 370 the prospective volunteer was convicted of a felony or has no felony convictions. The 371 local agency shall complete such form and shall provide same to the chief of the fire 372 department which requested information on a prospective volunteer. Such information 373 may be provided to the volunteer council. The provisions of paragraph (1) of this 374 subsection relating to privileged information and records of conviction data shall apply 375 to any information provided by a local agency to a local volunteer fire department."

376 **SECTION 12.**

377 Said article is further amended in Code Section 25-4-9, relating to basic firefighter training 378 course and transfer of certification, by revising subsection (a) as follows:

"(a)(1)(A) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, full-time, and part-time, and volunteer firefighters, including airport firefighters, shall successfully complete a basic training course. The council shall determine the course content, number of hours, and all other matters relative to basic firefighter training,

including airport rescue firefighter training <u>for full-time and part-time firefighters</u>.

Upon satisfactory completion of such basic training, a firefighter shall be issued a certificate of completion evidencing the same. Each firefighter shall be required to successfully complete such basic training course within 12 months after being employed or appointed as a firefighter or, in the case of airport firefighters, within such time period as the council may prescribe by rule or regulation.

(B) The volunteer council shall determine the course content, number of hours, and all

- (B) The volunteer council shall determine the course content, number of hours, and all other matters relative to basic firefighter training for volunteer firefighters. Each volunteer firefighter shall be required to complete such basic training course within 18 months after being appointed as volunteer firefighter.
- 393 (2) Each firefighter who presents to the council, or to the volunteer council in the case
 394 of volunteer firefighters, satisfactory documentation, as determined by the council or
 395 volunteer council, of his or her training as a member of the United States armed forces,
 396 the Georgia National Guard, or the Georgia Air National Guard shall be issued a
 397 certificate of completion by the council or volunteer council."

398 **SECTION 13.**

- 399 Said article is further amended by revising Cod Section 25-4-10, relating to mandatory 400 annual training, as follows:
- 401 "25-4-10.

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- 402 (a) As a condition of continued certification, all <u>full-time</u> and <u>part-time</u> firefighters shall
- 403 train, drill, or study at schools, classes, or courses at the local, area, or state level, as
- specified by the council. Authorized leaves of absence are expected.
- 405 (b) As a condition of continued certification, all volunteer firefighters shall train, drill, or
- 406 study at schools, classes, or courses at the local, area, or state level, as specified by the
- 407 <u>volunteer council</u>. Authorized leaves of absence are expected."

- 409 Code Section 45-9-101 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to definitions
- 410 relative to the temporary disability compensation program, is amended by revising
- 411 subparagraph (B) of paragraph (3) as follows:
- 412 "(B) Any individual serving as an officially recognized or designated member of a
- legally organized volunteer fire department certified in writing by the Georgia
- Firefighter Standards and Training Volunteer Fire Service Council pursuant to Code
- Section 25-3-22 who performs any acts or actions while on duty and when responding
- 416 to a fire or emergency during any fire or other emergency or while performing duties
- intended to protect life and property; or"

418 **SECTION 15.**

419 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
