## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 5 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to public water systems, so as to remove the Board of Natural Resources'
- 3 authority to require the regulation of fluoridation of potable public water supplies in certain
- 4 incorporated communities; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 5 other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 5 of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to public water systems, is amended by revising Code Section 12-5-175, relating to
- 10 fluoridation of public water systems, state funds for cost of fluoridation equipment,
- 11 chemicals, and materials, and tax deduction for fluoride-removing devices, as follows:
- 12 "12-5-175.
- 13 (a) The Board of Natural Resources shall <u>not</u> have the power to require, by regulation,
- 14 fluoridation of potable public water supplies in incorporated communities lying wholly
- within this state., provided that in no case should such fluoridation be required at a level
- 16 greater than one part per million parts of water; provided, further, that any municipality or
- 17 county and its water system can remove themselves from the terms of this part by

referendum called by petition of 10 percent of the registered voters in such political 18 subdivision who voted in the last general election. This applies to a referendum for or 19 20 against fluoridation. (b) No incorporated municipality, county, or public or private water authority shall be 21 22 required to comply with subsection (a) of this Code section unless the state has made 23 available funds for the cost of the fluoridation equipment, the installation of such 24 equipment, and the materials and chemicals required for six months of fluoridation of such 25 potable public water supplies. 26 (c) Any person who is deemed allergic to fluoridated water and who finds it necessary, 27 upon the advice of a physician or upon approval by the Department of Public Health, to purchase a device to remove the fluoride from the water may treat the cost of the device 28 as a tax-deductible medical expense." 29

30 SECTION 2.

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
