AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to the "Quality Basic Education Act," so as to provide for the Accelerated Career 3 Diploma Program; to provide a short title; to establish and provide for the ACE Grants 4 program; to provide for ACE (accelerated career education) grants for technical college 5 students pursuing certain degrees, diplomas, and certificates; to provide for reporting; to 6 provide for the adoption of content standards for a minimum course of instruction in 7 foundations of algebra; to revise a definition in the "Dual Enrollment Act"; to revise 8 provisions relating to the maximum of eligible dual enrollment courses allowable for 9 students; to make conforming changes; to extend an automatic repeal; to provide for related 10 matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

13 Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the 14 "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended in Part 2, relating to competencies and core 15 curriculum, by revising Code Section 20-2-149.2, relating to awarding of high school 16 diploma for completion of postsecondary programs and identification of critical needs fields 17 of study, as follows: 18 "20-2-149.2.

19	(a)	This Code section shall be known and ma	y be cited as the 'Accelerated Career Diploma
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- 20 <u>Program.'</u>
- 21 (b) A local board of education may shall be authorized to award a high school diploma to
- 22 a student enrolled in coursework pursuant to Code Section 20-2-161.3 who:
- 23 (1) Completes rigorous coursework at a postsecondary institution which meets the
 24 requirements in paragraph (7) of Code Section 20-3-519;
- (2)(1)(A) Has completed at least the following state required ninth and tenth grade
 level high school courses:
- 27 (i) The high school English course, including its end-of-course assessment, required
- 28 for purposes of federal accountability requirements, plus at least one additional state
- 29 <u>funded core English course;</u>
- 30 (ii) The high school math course, including its end-of-course assessment, required for
- 31 purposes of federal accountability requirements, plus either a state funded course on
- 32 <u>the foundations of algebra or one other state funded core math course;</u>
- 33 (iii) The high school science course, including its end-of-course assessment, required
- 34 for purposes of federal accountability requirements, plus at least one additional state
- 35 <u>funded core science course;</u>
- 36 (iv) Any two state funded core social studies courses; provided, however, that in lieu
- 37 of taking a second state funded core social studies course, a student shall be permitted
- 38 to take a third state funded math course in addition to the courses required in division
- 39 (ii) of this subparagraph, provided that such math course is aligned with competencies
- 40 required by such student's technical college program of study; and
- 41 (v) One health and physical education course.
- 42 (B) School personnel shall counsel each student to choose state funded courses
- 43 provided for in divisions (i) through (iv) of subparagraph (A) of this paragraph that
- 44 meet workforce needs and are appropriate for such student based on his or her

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45	competencies and on the competencies required in the technical college program of
46	study.
47	(C) As used in this paragraph, the term 'state funded core' courses shall include any
48	high school course listed as core or required on the state funded course list and any
49	technical college diploma-level or postsecondary degree-level English, math, science,
50	or social studies course for which the student earns dual credit.
51	(D) The State Board of Education shall adopt content standards for a minimum course
52	of instruction in foundations of algebra that may be chosen by students participating in
53	the Accelerated Career Diploma Program to meet the requirements of division (ii) of
54	subparagraph (A) of this paragraph; and
55	two English courses, two mathematics courses, two science courses, two social studies
56	courses, and one health and physical education course; and any state required tests
57	associated with any such courses;
58	(3) Receives a score of admission acceptable on the readiness assessment required by the
59	postsecondary institution; and
60	(4)(2)(A) Completes: (i) an associate associate's degree program in applied science at a
61	unit of the Technical College System of Georgia; (ii) a technical college diploma program
62	at a unit of the Technical College System of Georgia and all postsecondary academic
63	education and technical education and training prerequisites for any state, national, or
64	industry occupational certifications or licenses required to work in the field; or (iii) at
65	least two technical college certificate of credit programs in one specific career pathway
66	and all postsecondary academic education and technical education and training
67	prerequisites for any state, national, or industry occupational certifications or licenses
68	required to work in the field as determined by the Technical College System of Georgia
69	included in the High-demand Career List published by the State Workforce Development
70	Board as provided in Code section 34-14-3.

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71	(B) The State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia shall publish a list that
72	identifies which certificates are in the same program of study or closely related
72	programs of study. A student meets the requirements of division (iii) of subparagraph
73 74	(A) of this paragraph by completing at least two certificates in the same program of
75	study or in closely related programs of study.
76	(b) The State Board of the Technical College System of Georgia shall annually identify
77	fields of study in which a critical need or shortage of trained personnel exists in the labor
78	markets in this state and provide such information to the State Board of Education. The
79	State Board of Education shall annually provide such information to local school systems
80	for the purpose of emphasizing areas of critical workforce needs and shortages in the
81	labor markets in our state to high school students to support their career pathway
82	decisions.
83	(c) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Board of the Technical
84	College System of Georgia and the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia,
85	shall establish rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Code section.
86	(d) A student who meets the requirements of subsection (a) (b) of this Code section shall
87	be deemed to have met all graduation requirements of the State Board of Education and
88	shall not be subject to any assessments otherwise required for purposes of graduation.
89	(e)(1) There is established the ACE Grants program to provide for awarding accelerated
90	career education grants to students participating in the Accelerated Career Diploma
91	Program, as provided for in this Code section.
92	(2) The Georgia Student Finance Commission shall be authorized to provide funds
93	appropriated by the General Assembly for the implementation of a program to award
94	ACE grants to students pursuing a degree, diploma, or certificate provided for in
95	paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code section.
96	(3) The Georgia Student Finance Commission shall assess the program and shall, no later
07	then December 1 of each year during the preserver provide the Governor the Lieutenent

97 than December 1 of each year during the program, provide the Governor, the Lieutenant

98	Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the director of the Office of
99	Planning and Budget, and the chairpersons of the House Committee on Education, the
100	Senate Education and Youth Committee, the House Committee on Higher Education, and
101	the Senate Higher Education Committee with a comprehensive report to include
102	recommendations as to the program's continued implementation and any changes deemed
103	necessary for such program.
104	(4) The Georgia Student Finance Commission, in consultation with the State Board of
105	the Technical College System of Georgia and the State Board of Education, shall
106	establish rules and regulations consistent with the provisions of this Code section to

107 implement, assess, and report on the program."

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SECTION 2.

109 Said article is further amended in Part 4, relating to financing, by revising paragraph (7) of 110 subsection (b), paragraph (3) of subsection (f), and subsection (g) of Code Section 111 20-2-161.3, relating to the "Dual Enrollment Act," purpose, dual credit courses, eligibility 112 for participation, and eligibility for payment, as follows:

113 "(7) 'Eligible dual credit course' means a dual credit course which is included in the 114 eligible course list and which is eligible for payment under this program subject to the 115 following maximum credit hour caps:

116 (A) Eligible high school students with 18 or fewer semester hours, or the equivalent

117 amount of guarter hours, of dual credit courses funded under this part on or before June

118 30, 2020, shall be limited to a total of 30 semester hours, or the equivalent amount of

119 quarter hours, of eligible dual credit courses; and

120 (B) Eligible high school students with 19 or more semester hours, or the equivalent

121 amount of quarter hours, of dual credit courses funded under this part on or before June

122 30, 2020, shall be limited to 12 additional semester hours, or the equivalent amount of

123 quarter hours, of eligible dual credit courses."

124 "(3) The local board of education or other authorized governing body of a A participating 125 eligible high school shall be required to award a high school diploma to an eligible high 126 school student who is enrolled at or through an eligible postsecondary institution under 127 the program as so long as the credit earned at or through such postsecondary institution 128 satisfies course requirements needed for the eligible high school student to complete high school graduation provided in subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-149.2. The State 129 130 Board of Education, in consultation with the State Board of the Technical College System 131 of Georgia and the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, shall 132 determine appropriate courses to meet these requirements. No later than July 1, 2015, the department shall communicate to high schools the subject area requirements or elective 133 courses that may be satisfied with dual credit courses provided by eligible postsecondary 134 135 institutions, which shall include completion of: 136 (A) At least the following state required ninth and tenth grade level high school courses 137 or their equivalent: two English courses, two mathematics courses, two science courses, two social studies courses, and one health and physical education course; and any state 138 139 required tests associated with any such courses; and 140 (B) One of the following: 141 (i) An associate degree program;

(ii) A technical college diploma program and all postsecondary academic education
 and technical education and training prerequisites for any state, national, or industry
 occupational certifications or licenses required to work in the field; or

(iii) At least two technical college certificate of credit programs in one specific career
 pathway and all postsecondary academic education and technical education and
 training prerequisites for any state, national, or industry occupational certifications or
 licenses required to work in the field as determined by the Technical College System

B. 440 - 6 - 150 Students who have taken dual credit courses in pursuit of a high school diploma under 151 this paragraph, and were funded under this part, on or before June 30, 2020, shall not be 152 subject to any maximum credit hour caps as set forth in this Code section. Such students 153 may continue participation in the program until the student completes the coursework required for his or her high school diploma." 154 ''(g)(1) Each eligible student shall be limited to a total of 30 semester hours, or the 155 156 equivalent amount of quarter hours, of eligible dual credit courses funded under this part; 157 provided, however, that, subject to appropriations specifically for such purpose, the 158 commission shall be authorized to waive such limitation for students participating in the 159 Accelerated Career Diploma Program provided for in Code Section 20-2-149.2 to the 160 extent necessary for such students to complete such program. (2) Hours for <u>eligible</u> dual credit courses taken at or through an eligible postsecondary 161 162 institution pursuant to this Code section by an eligible high school student shall not count 163 against any maximum hourly caps which may be applicable for purposes of HOPE

164 scholarships or grants."

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SECTION 3.

166 Said article is further amended in said part by revising the undesignated text at the end of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) and subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-161.4, relating to 167 168 accessing HOPE scholarship funds for dual enrolled students and termination, as follows: 169 "No later than January 1 each year, the Georgia Student Finance Commission shall provide an interim report to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the 170 House of Representatives, the director of the Office of Planning and Budget, and the 171 chairpersons of the House Committee on Education, the Senate Education and Youth 172 173 Committee, the House Committee on Higher Education, and the Senate Higher Education Committee. A final report shall be provided to the same no later than September 174 December 1, 2026 2027." 175

- 176 "(b) This Code section shall stand repealed on June 30, 2026 <u>2027</u>."
- 177 **SECTION 4.**
- 178 This Act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

179 **SECTION 5.**

180 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
