A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 libraries, so as to require the board of regents to adopt the American Library Association's
- 3 Library Bill of Rights; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 4 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to libraries, is
- 8 amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 20-5-2, relating to powers and duties
- 9 of the board of regents and director of University of Georgia Libraries, abolition of State
- 10 Library Commission and transfer of functions, reports of state publications, and electronic
- 11 submission, to read as follows:
- 12 "(n) The board of regents shall adopt the American Library Association's Library Bill of
- Rights that indicates materials which should not be proscribed or removed because of
- partisan or doctrinal disapproval or, in the alternative, shall develop a written statement
- declaring the inherent authority of a library or library system to provide an adequate
- 16 collection of books and other materials sufficient in size to satisfy the needs of library

patrons or the community served by a city, county, or regional library system and prohibiting the practice of banning specific books or other materials."

19 SECTION 2.

- 20 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-3, relating to disbursement
- 21 of funds, as follows:
- 22 "20-5-3.
- 23 (a) In order to effectuate the purposes of this article there shall be made available to the
- board of regents whatever funds may be duly allocated to it by the proper authority, either
- by specific appropriation or otherwise as now provided by law, and the board of regents
- shall be authorized to disburse such funds to public libraries serving persons of all ages
- through legally constituted municipal library boards or to the other legally constituted local
- library boards as may now or hereafter be established by law. The board of regents shall
- use such funds for the purpose of aiding and supplementing the establishment and
- development of public library services.
- 31 (b) In order to be eligible for state funds, a library or library system shall adopt the
- 32 <u>American Library Association's Library Bill of Rights that indicates materials which should</u>
- 33 not be proscribed or removed because of partisan or doctrinal disapproval or, in the
- 34 <u>alternative</u>, shall develop a written statement prohibiting the practice of banning books or
- 35 other materials within the library or library system."

36 SECTION 3.

37 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
