## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on the Premium Assistance Program; and for other

2 purposes.

WHEREAS, premium assistance is an alternative to the expansion of Medicaid that assists
individuals with purchasing coverage through private group health plans; and

5 WHEREAS, this option will provide much needed health insurance coverage for a portion

6 of the population that has an income too high to qualify for Medicaid but too low to qualify

7 for subsidies provided by the federal government; and

8 WHEREAS, this alternative to Medicaid expansion increases private health care options and
9 decreases the cost of government operated programs; and

WHEREAS, this option has been successfully utilized by other states that have found that it improves access to quality health care, attracts insurance carriers, enhances competition in the insurance marketplace, promotes individually owned health insurance, strengthens personal responsibility, reduces the size of the state administered Medicaid program, and discourages overuse, among other benefits; and

15 WHEREAS, the premium assistance program which utilizes federal Medicaid funds to 16 purchase private coverage and requires individuals who wish to participate to contribute to

17 their premiums warrants further consideration and study.

## 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:

19 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Study Committee

20 on the Premium Assistance Program.

(2) Members and officers. The committee shall be composed of six members of the
 Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate. The President shall designate a
 member of the committee as chairperson of the committee.

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(3) Powers and duties. The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

(4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

31 (5) Allowances and funding.

32 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
33 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.

(B) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
 of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
 appropriated to the Senate.

38 (6) **Report.** 

(A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.

(B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
of this paragraph.

46 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of

47 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.

- 48 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
  49 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 50 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- 51 of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 52 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2016.
