A RESOLUTION

Recognizing February 7 to 14, 2023, as Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week at the
 state capitol; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, congenital heart defects are one of the most frequently occurring birth defects
and a leading cause of deaths related to birth defects worldwide; and

5 WHEREAS, over one million families across America face the challenges and hardships of
6 raising children with congenital heart defects, and each year, approximately 40,000 babies
7 are born in the United States with these conditions; and

8 WHEREAS, some congenital heart defects are not diagnosed until months or years after
9 birth; when these conditions go undiagnosed, they can cause many cases of sudden cardiac
10 death in young athletes; and

WHEREAS, despite these alarming statistics, newborns and young athletes are still notregularly screened for congenital heart defects; and

WHEREAS, Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week provides an opportunity for families
whose lives have been affected by congenital heart defects to celebrate life, remember the

- 15 loved ones they have lost, honor dedicated health professionals, and share information with
- 16 the public and the media.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
recognize February 7 to 14, 2023, as Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week at the state
