ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Senate Study Committee on Combat Sports; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, research shows that mixed martial arts and unarmed combat sports are the
- 3 fastest growing sports, both for participants and spectators, in the world; and
- 4 WHEREAS, mixed martial arts is rapidly becoming the highest grossing sports industry in
- 5 the world; and
- 6 WHEREAS, mixed martial arts is also becoming one of the most regulated sports industries
- 7 in the world; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has participated in the past by hosting world championship
- 9 title fights; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia has recently become one of the top destinations in the world for the
- 11 entertainment industry; and
- 12 WHEREAS, this state is uniquely positioned to capitalize on the positive economic
- development effects of this rapidly growing industry; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the laws in this area have not been studied or changed in decades to reflect the
- 15 new research regarding unarmed combat, including mixed martial arts; and
- 16 WHEREAS, study in this area is necessary to determine if legislative changes are warranted
- and needed in order to focus on the safety of the sport by addressing extreme weight cutting
- and other related issues, to further devote attention to the economic impact of supporting
- 19 mixed martial arts and other unarmed combat sports in order to identify the magnitude of the
- 20 benefits to this state's economy, and to ensure this state is highly competitive in hosting and
- 21 supporting such global sporting events.

- 22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
- 23 (1) **Creation of Senate study committee.** There is created the Senate Study Committee
- on Combat Sports.

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- 25 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of seven members. The
- 26 President of the Senate shall appoint four members of the Senate as members of the
- committee and shall designate one of such members as chairperson. The President of the
- Senate shall also appoint an additional three members of the committee as follows:
- 29 (i) One member with expertise in sports medicine;
 - (ii) One member with regulatory expertise in athletic, unarmed combat sports; and
- 31 (iii) One member from an industry organization or group with expertise in the
- promotion and production of unarmed combat events in the State of Georgia.
- 33 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 36 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
 - (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.
- 41 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- (B) Members of the committee who are state officials, other than legislative members,
- or state employees shall receive no compensation for their services on the committee,
- but they may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them in the performance of their
- duties as members of the committee in the same manner as they are reimbursed for
- 47 expenses in their capacities as state officials or employees.
- 48 (C) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state
- 49 employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that
- specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state
- 52 employees.
- 53 (D) The allowances and expenses authorized by this resolution shall not be received
- by any member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are
- authorized. Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come
- from funds appropriated to the Senate; except that funds for the reimbursement of the
- expenses of state officials, other than legislative members, and state employees shall
- 58 come from funds appropriated to or otherwise available to their respective agencies.

- 59 (6) **Report.**
- 60 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that 61 include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the 62 same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 67 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 70 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 71 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- of the Senate copies of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 73 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2018.
