## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-30-5-18.

**Synopsis:** Meningococcal disease information for students. Establishes additional information that a school chief administrative officer must give to students or parents of students about meningococcal disease and immunizations. Provides that the department of education (department), in consultation with the state department of health, must develop and make available materials in the most cost effective and efficient manner. Provides that the department must post the information on its Internet web site.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1011**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

33	department shall post the information on the department's Interne
34	web site.

(d) The department shall enforce this section.



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
