DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 34-20-3.

Synopsis: Product liability actions. Specifies causes of action that may constitute a product liability action. Repeals provisions pertaining to product liability actions that are based on: (1) property damage resulting from asbestos; and (2) personal injury, disability, disease, or death resulting from exposure to asbestos.

HOUSE BILL No. 1012

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning civil procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 34-20-3-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 1. (a) This section
3	applies to all persons regardless of minority or legal disability.
4	Notwithstanding IC 34-11-6-1, this section applies in any product
5	liability action in which the theory of liability is negligence or strict
6	liability in tort, including any action for:
7	(1) personal injury;
8	(2) disability;
9	(3) disease; or
0	(4) death;
1	as a result of protracted exposure to a foreign substance that is
2	introduced into the body.
3	(b) Except as provided in section 2 of this chapter, A product
4	liability action must be commenced:
5	(1) within two (2) years after the cause of action accrues; or
6	(2) within ten (10) years after the delivery of the product to the
7	initial user or consumer.

1	However, if the cause of action accrues at least eight (8) years but less
2	than ten (10) years after that initial delivery, the action may be
3	commenced at any time within two (2) years after the cause of action
4	accrues.
5	SECTION 2. IC 34-20-3-2 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
6	2019]. Sec. 2. (a) A product liability action that is based on:
7	(1) property damage resulting from asbestos; or
8	(2) personal injury, disability, disease, or death resulting from
9	exposure to asbestos;
10	must be commenced within two (2) years after the cause of action
11	accrues. The subsequent development of an additional asbestos related
12	disease or injury is a new injury and is a separate cause of action.
13	(b) A product liability action for personal injury, disability, disease,
14	or death resulting from exposure to asbestos accrues on the date when
15	the injured person knows that the person has an asbestos related
16	disease or injury.
17	(c) A product liability action for property damage accrues on the
18	date when the injured person knows that the property damage has
19	resulted from asbestos.
20	(d) This section applies only to product liability actions against:
21	(1) persons who mined and sold commercial asbestos; and
22	(2) funds that have, as a result of bankruptcy proceedings or to
23	avoid bankruptcy proceedings, been created for the payment of
24	asbestos related disease claims or asbestos related property
25	damage claims.
26	(e) For the purposes of IC 1-1-1-8, if any part of this section is held
27	invalid, the entire section is void.
28	(f) Except for the cause of action expressly recognized in this
29	section, this section does not otherwise modify the limitation of action
30	or repose period contained in section 1 of this chapter.
