DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 15-20-1-3.

Synopsis: Strict liability for dog bites. Holds a dog owner or custodian strictly liable for a dog bite or injury when: (1) a dog bites or injures a person without provocation; and (2) the person is bitten or injured while in a location the person is legally authorized to occupy.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning agriculture and animals.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

8	(A) the laws of Indiana;
9	(B) the laws of the United States; or
0	(C) the postal regulations of the United States; is legally
1	authorized to occupy;
2	the owner or custodian of the dog is liable for all damages, including
3	punitive damages, suffered by the person bitten or injured.
4	(b) The owner or custodian of a dog described in subsection (a) is
5	liable for all damages, including punitive damages, even if:
6	(1) the dog has not previously behaved in a vicious manner; or



1 (2) the owner has no knowledge of prior vicious behavior by the dog.
