## **HOUSE BILL No. 1113**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-28-7.

**Synopsis:** Foster parent bill of rights. Requires the department of child services (department) to create and make available to a foster parent a bill of rights (bill of rights) for foster parents. Provides information that must be included in a bill of rights developed by the department. Requires the department to distribute the bill of rights annually and upon request. Requires the department to make the bill of rights available on the department's Internet web site.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1113**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 31-28-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY

4	Chapter 7. Foster Parent Rights
5	Sec. 1. The department shall create and make available to a
6	foster parent a bill of rights for foster parents that includes the
7	following information:
8	(1) The right to be treated with dignity, respect, and
9	consideration as a professional member of the child welfare
10	team.
11	(2) The right to be provided with standardized preservice
12	training and appropriate ongoing training to:
13	(A) meet mutually assessed needs;
14	(B) keep apprised of changes in department policies and
15	procedures; and
16	(C) continue to improve the foster parent's ability to be an
17	effective member of the child welfare team.



1	(3) The right to be informed on how to contact the
2	appropriate child placing agency or the department in order
3	to receive information and assistance in accessing support
4	services for a child placed with the foster parent.
5	(4) The right to:
6	(A) receive information concerning costs to the foster
7	parent that may be eligible for reimbursement; and
8	(B) receive timely financial reimbursement from the
9	department.
10	(5) The right to be provided information about the
1	department's plan concerning a child's placement in the
12	family foster home.
13	(6) The right to:
14	(A) receive notice of an enforcement action; and
15	(B) request an administrative hearing concerning a
16	decision by the department to impose a sanction;
17	under IC 31-27-4.
18	(7) The right to receive additional or necessary information
19	that is relevant to the care of a child at any time the child is
20	placed with the foster parent.
21	(8) The right to request that the department permit a child
22	who is placed with the foster parent to have visitation with the
23	child's sibling if the child or the child's sibling, or both,
24	receive foster care under IC 31-28-5-3.
25	(9) The right to receive notice of:
26	(A) a collaborative care agreement review hearing;
27	(B) a detention hearing;
28	(C) an initial hearing and any additional initial hearing;
29	(D) a factfinding hearing;
30	(E) a dispositional hearing;
31	(F) a periodic case review hearing, including a case review
32	that is a permanency hearing; or
33	(G) a hearing on a petition or motion for termination of
34	parental rights;
35	concerning a child who has been placed with the foster parent.
36	(10) The right to cooperate with the department in the
37	development of a case plan for a child concerning:
38	(A) rehabilitation of the child and the child's parents,
39	guardians, and custodians;
10	(B) visitation arrangements; and
<b>1</b> 1	(C) services required to meet the special needs of the child.
12	(11) The right to be given a fair opportunity to controvert any



1	part of a predispositional report admitted into evidence if the
2	foster parent is entitled to notice of the dispositional hearing
3	(12) The right to have the juvenile court consider the foster
4	parent's recommendations for the needs of the child for care
5	treatment, rehabilitation, or placement before entering a
6	dispositional decree or a modification to a dispositional decree
7	in a child in need of services proceeding.
8	(13) The right to petition the court to request intervention as
9	a party to a child in need of services proceeding.
10	(14) The right to be consulted by the department concerning
l 1	the progress made by a child who is placed with the foster
12	parent.
13	(15) The right to receive a report prepared by the state
14	concerning a child placed with the foster parent.
15	(16) The right to be considered as a placement option when
16	the department is attempting to find placement for a child
17	who was previously placed with the foster parent.
18	Sec. 2. The department shall make the bill of rights for foster
19	parents available on the department's Internet web site.
20	Sec. 3. The department shall provide a foster parent a copy of
21	the bill of rights for foster parents:
22	(1) annually; and
23	(2) upon request.
