#### HOUSE BILL No. 1151

DIGEST OF HB 1151 (Updated January 14, 2020 11:47 am - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 5-10.

**Synopsis:** School resource officers. Adds a school resource officer to the definition of "public safety officer" as it relates to the public employee benefits special death benefit fund (fund). Provides that a school resource officer qualifies for the fund if the school resource officer is not otherwise entitled to a line of duty benefit under the 1925 police pension fund, 1953 police pension fund (Indianapolis), or the 1977 police officers' and firefighters' pension and disability fund.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
