## **HOUSE BILL No. 1195**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 3-10-7-32; IC 3-11; IC 3-12-1.

**Synopsis:** Straight ticket voting. Removes a voter's option to vote for all candidates of a political party or an independent ticket at one time (straight ticket voting) in a general or municipal election, except for candidates for presidential electors. Repeals superseded statutes relating to straight ticket voting.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1195**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- SECTION 1. IC 3-10-7-32, AS AMENDED BY P.L.190-2011, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 32. (a) A town election board shall determine what voting method will be used in a municipal election.
- (b) The town election board and its precinct election officers shall perform the duties of the county election board and its precinct election officers under IC 3-11 for each voting method used.
- (c) The town election board shall prepare the ballots in the form prescribed by IC 3-11 and distribute them to the precincts in the town.
- (d) This subsection applies only to paper ballots. Notwithstanding subsection (c), the town election board, by unanimous consent of the board's entire membership, may authorize the printing or reproduction of ballots on equipment under the control of the town clerk-treasurer. If the town election board acts under this subsection, the ballots are not required to conform to the precise dimensions concerning the size of political party devices under IC 3-11-2-9 or the placement of a candidate's name under IC 3-11-2-10(f). IC 3-11-2-10(d). However,



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1	the ballots must otherwise substantially conform with IC 3-11-2.
2	SECTION 2. IC 3-11-2-10, AS AMENDED BY THE TECHNICAL
3	CORRECTIONS BILL OF THE 2021 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IS
4	AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]:
5	Sec. 10. (a) Public questions shall be placed on the general election
6	ballot in the following order after the statement described in section 7
7	of this chapter, and the instructions described in subsections (d) and (e)
8	subsection (c) and section 8 of this chapter, if instructions are printed
9	on the ballot:
10	(1) Ratification of a state constitutional amendment.
11	(2) Local public questions.
12	Subject to section 10.1 of this chapter, each public question shall be
13	placed in a separate column on the ballot.
14	(b) The name or title of the political party or independent ticket
15	described in section 6 of this chapter shall be placed on the general
16	election ballot after the public questions described in subsection (a).
17	The device of the political party or independent ticket shall be placed
18	immediately under the name of the political party or independent ticket.
19	Notwithstanding section 8(b) of this chapter, the instructions for voting
20	a straight party ticket shall be placed to the right of the device on the
21	<del>ballot.</del>
22	(c) The instructions for voting a straight party ticket must conform
23	as nearly as possible to the following:
24	"(1) You are not required to vote a straight party ticket. If you do
25	not wish to vote a straight party ticket, do not make a mark in this
26	section, and proceed to voting the ballot by office.
27	(2) To vote a straight (insert political party name) ticket for all
28	(insert political party name) candidates on this ballot, except for
29	candidates described in (3) below, make a voting mark on or in
30	this circle and do not make any other marks on this ballot.
31	(3) To vote for any candidate for an at-large office (insert county
32	council, city common council, town council, or township board if
33	those offices appear on this ballot) to which more than one (1)
34	person may be elected, you must make another voting mark for
35	each candidate you wish to vote for. Your straight party vote will
36	not count as a vote for any candidate for that office.
37	(4) If you wish to vote for a candidate seeking a nonpartisan office
38	or on a public question, you must make another voting mark on
39	the appropriate place on this ballot.".

(d) Except as permitted under section 8(b) of this chapter, if the

ballot contains an independent ticket described in section 6 of this

chapter and at least one (1) other independent candidate, the ballot



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must also contain a statement that reads substantially as follows: "A
vote cast for an independent ticket will only be counted for the
candidates for President and Vice President or governor and lieutenant
governor comprising that independent ticket. This vote will NOT be
counted for any OTHER independent candidate appearing on the
hallot "

- (e) (c) Except as permitted under section 8(b) of this chapter, the ballot must also contain a statement that reads substantially as follows: "A write-in vote will NOT be counted unless the vote is for a DECLARED write-in candidate. To vote for a write-in candidate, you must make a voting mark on or in the square to the left of the name you have written in or your vote will not be counted."
- (f) (d) Subject to section 10.1 of this chapter, the list of candidates of the political party shall be placed immediately under the instructions for voting a straight party ticket. The names of the candidates shall be placed three-fourths (3/4) of an inch apart from center to center of the name. The name of each candidate must have, immediately on its left, a square three-eighths (3/8) of an inch on each side.
- (g) (e) The circuit court clerk may authorize the printing of ballots containing a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper version of a ballot is used within a precinct.
- SECTION 3. IC 3-11-2-12.4, AS ADDED BY P.L.21-2016, SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 12.4. (a) This section applies whenever more than one (1) candidate may be elected to an office.
- (b) The office shall be placed on the general election ballot after the offices described in section 12 of this chapter and before the offices described in section 12.9 of this chapter.
- (c) The ballot shall contain a statement reading substantially as follows above the name of the first candidate: "To vote for any candidate for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate you wish to vote for.". A straight party vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.".
- SECTION 4. IC 3-11-7-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.278-2019, SECTION 65, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 4. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), A ballot card voting system must permit a voter to vote:
  - (1) except at a primary election, a straight party ticket for all of the candidates of one (1) political party by a single voting mark on each ballot card;
  - (2) (1) for one (1) or more candidates of each political party or independent candidates, or for one (1) or more school board



1	candidates nominated by petition; or
2	(3) (2) a split ticket for the candidates of different political parties
3	and for independent candidates. or
4	(4) a straight party ticket and then split that ticket by casting
5	individual votes for candidates of another political party or
6	independent candidate.
7	(b) A ballot card voting system must require that a voter who wishes
8	to east a ballot for a candidate for election to an at-large district to
9	which more than one person may be elected, on a:
10	(1) county council;
11	(2) city common council;

14	make a voting mark for each individual candidate for whom the voter
15	wishes to cast a vote. The ballot card voting system may not count any

19	(1) for all candidates for presidential electors and alternate
20	presidential electors of a political party or an independent ticket
21	by making a single voting mark; and
22	(2) for or against a public question on which the voter may vote.
23	SECTION 5. IC 3-11-7-6 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
24	2021]. Sec. 6. A ballot card voting system must count a ballot in
25	accordance with IC 3-12-1-7 when a voter votes a straight ticket vote
26	and votes for individual candidates as described by IC 3-12-1-7.
27	SECTION 6. IC 3-11-7.5-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.278-2019,
28	SECTION 66, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
29	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 10. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), An
30	electronic voting system must permit a voter to vote:
31	(1) except at a primary election, a straight party ticket for all the
32	candidates of one (1) political party by touching the device of that
33	<del>party;</del>
34	(2) (1) for one (1) or more candidates of each political party or
35	independent candidates, or for one (1) or more school board
36	candidates nominated by petition; or
37	(3) (2) a split ticket for the candidates of different political parties
38	and for independent candidates. or
39	(4) a straight party ticket and then split that ticket by casting
40	individual votes for candidates of another political party or
41	independent candidates.
42	(b) An electronic voting system must require that a voter who

21	voter desires to vote for all the candidates of one (1) political party or
22	group of petitioners, the voter may make a voting mark on or in a large
23	circle enclosing the device and before the name under which the
24	candidates of the party or group of petitioners are printed. The voter's
25	vote shall then be counted for all the candidates under that party name
26	or for the two (2) candidates comprising an independent ticket.
27	SECTION 8. IC 3-11-13-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.141-2020,
28	SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
29	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 11. (a) The ballot information, whether placed on
30	the ballot card or on the marking device, must be in the order of
31	arrangement provided for ballots under this section.
32	(b) Each county election board shall have the names of all
33	candidates for all elected offices, political party offices, and public
34	questions printed on a ballot card as provided in this chapter. The
35	county may:
36	(1) print all offices and questions on a single ballot card; and
37	(2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper
38	version of a ballot is used within a precinct.
39	(c) Each type of ballot card must be of uniform size and of the same
40	quality and color of paper (except as permitted under IC 3-10-1-17).
41	(d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate
42	or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by



- petitioners shall be listed on the ballot with the name and device set forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the device may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the device. IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not include a name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2) or more parties or petitioners.
- (e) The offices and public questions on the general election ballot must be placed on the ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12, IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a), IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c), IC 3-11-2-14(a), and IC 3-11-2-14(d). The offices and public questions may be listed in a continuous column **or row** either vertically or horizontally and on a number of separate pages.
- (f) The name of each office must be printed in a uniform size in bold type. A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the first candidate:
  - (1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be elected to the office.
  - (2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. To vote for any candidate for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate you wish to vote for.", A straight party vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1) candidate is to be elected to the office.
- (g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be grouped together in the following order:
  - (1) The major political party whose candidate received the highest greatest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the last most recent election for secretary of state is listed first.
  - (2) The major political party whose candidate received the second highest greatest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the most recent election for secretary of state is listed second.
  - (3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties' candidates for secretary of state finished in the last most recent election for secretary of state are listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).
  - (4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of state in the last most recent election for secretary of state or a nominee is an independent candidate or independent ticket



1	(described in IC 3-11-2-6), the party or candidate is listed after
2	the parties described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
3	(5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate
4	or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the ballot,
5	the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in which
6	the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.
7	(6) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates listed
8	in subdivisions (1) through (5), if required by law.
9	(7) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the
10	ballot.
11	(h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established by
12	subsection (g) must be printed in type with uniform capital letters and
13	have a uniform space between each name. The name of the candidate's
14	political party, or the word "Independent" if the:
15	(1) candidate; or
16	(2) ticket of candidates for:
17	(A) President and Vice President of the United States; or
18	(B) governor and lieutenant governor;
19	is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name
20	of the candidate and must be printed in a uniform size and type.
21	(i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to
22	at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision
23	must be grouped together:
24	(1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
25	(2) in the order established by subsection (g); and
26	(3) within the political party, in alphabetical order according to
27	surname.
28	A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
29	immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
30	first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
31	candidates to be elected) candidate(s) of ANY party for this office.".
32	(j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body
33	of a school corporation must be grouped:
34	(1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
35	and
36	(2) in alphabetical order according to surname.
37	A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
38	immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
39	first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of

(k) The following information must be placed at the top of the ballot



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- (1) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7.
- (2) The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-8  $\frac{1C}{3-11-2-10(d)}$ , and  $\frac{1C}{3-11-2-10(e)}$ . IC 3-11-2-10(c).
- (1) The ballot must include: a single connectable arrow, circle, oval, or square, or a voting position for voting a straight party or an independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) by one (1) mark as required by section 14 of this chapter, and the single connectable arrow, circle, oval, or square, or the voting position for easting a straight party or an independent ticket ballot must be identified by:
  - (1) the name of the political party or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6); and
  - (2) immediately below or beside the political party's or independent ticket's name, the device of that party or ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-5).

The name and device of each political party or independent ticket must be of uniform size and type and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for listing candidates under each office. The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-10(e) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement concerning presidential electors required under IC 3-10-4-3 must be placed on the ballot label. The instructions for voting a straight party ticket must include the statement: "If you do not wish to vote a straight party ticket, do not make a mark in this section and proceed to voting the ballot by office:".

- (m) A public question must be in the form described in IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a single connectable arrow, a circle, or an oval may be used instead of a square. Except as expressly authorized or required by statute, a county election board may not print a ballot card that contains language concerning the public question other than the language authorized by a statute.
  - (n) The requirements in this section:
    - (1) do not replace; and
    - (2) are in addition to;
- any other requirements in this title that apply to optical scan ballots.
- (o) The procedure described in IC 3-11-2-16 must be used when a ballot does not comply with the requirements imposed by this title or contains another error or omission that might result in confusion or mistakes by voters.
- (p) This subsection applies to an optical scan ballot that does not list:
  - (1) the names of political parties or candidates; or
- (2) the text of public questions; on the face of the ballot. The ballot must be prepared in accordance



with this section, except that the ballot must include a numbered circle
or oval to refer to each political party, candidate, or public question.
SECTION 9. IC 3-11-13-14 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
2021]. Sec. 14. (a) In partisan elections, the ballot labels must include
a voting square or position where a voter may by one (1) voting mark
on each card record a straight party or an independent ticket vote for all
the eandidates of one (1) political party or the independent ticket,
except for offices for which the voter:

- (1) is required to east an individual vote for a candidate under IC 3-11-7-4(b); or
- (2) has voted individually for a candidate for any other office.
- (b) If the voter records a vote for the two (2) candidates comprising an independent ticket, the vote must not count for any other independent candidate on the ballot.

SECTION 10. IC 3-11-13-22, AS AMENDED BY P.L.135-2020, SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 22. (a) This section applies to:

- (1) a ballot card voting system; and
- (2) a voting system that includes features of a ballot card voting system and a direct record electronic voting system.
- (b) Not later than seventy-four (74) days before election day, for each county planning to use automatic tabulating machines at the next election, VSTOP shall provide each county election board with a randomly sorted list of unique identification numbers for the inventory of machines in the county maintained under IC 3-11-16-4. Starting at the top of the list, the county election board shall select machines in the list in the order listed so that:
  - (1) if a machine to be selected in the list is not scheduled to be used in the upcoming election, the selection process will move to the next machine in the order listed;
  - (2) each selected machine is scheduled to be used in the upcoming election; and
  - (3) the number of machines selected is not less than five percent (5%) of the machines in the county scheduled by the county election board to be used in the upcoming election.
- (c) The county election board shall test the machines as described in subsection (b) to ascertain that the machines will correctly count the votes cast for straight party tickets, for all candidates (including write-in candidates) and on all public questions. If an individual attending the public test requests that additional automatic tabulating machines be tested, then the county election board shall select and test additional machines from the list in the manner described in subsection



1	(b).
2	(d) If VSTOP does not provide the lists under subsection (b) not
3	later than sixty (60) days before the election, the county election board
4	shall establish and implement a procedure for random selection of not
5	less than five percent (5%) of the machines in the county to be used in
6	the upcoming election. The county election board shall then test the
7	machines selected as described in subsection (c).
8	(e) Not later than seven (7) days after conducting the test under
9	subsection (c), the county election board shall certify to the election
10	division that the test has been conducted in conformity with subsection
11	(c). The testing under subsection (c) must begin before absentee voting
12	begins in the office of the circuit court clerk under IC 3-11-10-26.
13	(f) Public notice of the time and place shall be given at least
14	forty-eight (48) hours before the test. The notice shall be published
15	once in accordance with IC 5-3-1-4.
16	(g) If a county election board determines that:
17	(1) a ballot:
18	(A) must be reprinted or corrected as provided by
19	IC 3-11-2-16 because of the omission of a candidate, political
20	party, or public question from the ballot; or
21	(B) is an absentee ballot that a voter is entitled to recast under
22	IC 3-11.5-4-2 because the absentee ballot includes a candidate
23	for election to office who:
24	(i) ceased to be a candidate; and
25	(ii) has been succeeded by a candidate selected under
26	IC 3-13-1 or IC 3-13-2; and
27	(2) ballots used in the test conducted under this section were not
28	reprinted or corrected to remove the omission of a candidate,
29	political party, or public question, or indicate the name of the
30	successor candidate;
31	the county election board shall conduct an additional public test
32	described in subsection (c) using the reprinted or corrected ballots.
33	Notice of the time and place of the additional test shall be given in
34	accordance with IC 5-14-1.5, but publication of the notice in
35	accordance with IC 5-3-1-4 is not required.
36	SECTION 11. IC 3-11-13-31.7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.21-2016,
37	SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
38	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 31.7. (a) This section is enacted to comply with
39	52 U.S.C. 21081 by establishing uniform and nondiscriminatory
40	standards to define what constitutes a vote on an optical scan voting
41	system.

(b) After receiving ballot cards, a voter shall, without leaving the



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1	room, go alone into one (1) of the booths or compartments that is
2	unoccupied and indicate:
3	(1) the candidates for whom the voter desires to vote by marking
4	the connectable arrows, circles, ovals, or squares immediately
5	beside:
6	(A) the candidates' names; or
7	(B) the numbers referring to the candidates; and
8	(2) the voter's preference on each public question by marking the
9	connectable arrow, oval, or square beside:
10	(A) the word "yes" or "no" under the question; or
11	(B) the number referring to the word "yes" or "no" on the

14	desires to vote for all the candidates of one (1) political party or
15	independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6), the voter may mark:

18	section 11 of this chapter;
19	that designates the candidates of that political party or independent
20	ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6). Except as provided by
21	IC 3-11-7-4(b), the voter's vote shall then be counted for all the
22	candidates of that political party or included in the independent ticket
23	(described in IC 3-11-2-6). However, if the voter marks the circle,
24	arrow, oval, or square of an independent ticket (described in
25	IC 3-11-2-6), the vote shall not be counted for any other independent
26	candidate on the ballot.
27	(d) (c) This subsection applies to a voter casting a ballot on a voting
28	system that includes features of both an optical scan ballot card voting
29	system and a direct record electronic voting system. After entering into
30	a booth used with the voting system, the voter shall indicate the
31	candidates for whom the voter desires to vote and the voter's preference
32	on each public question by:
33	(1) inserting a paper ballot or an optical scan ballot into the voting
34	system; or
35	(2) using headphones to listen to a recorded list of political
36	parties, candidates, and public questions.
37	(e) (d) A voter using a voting system described in subsection (d) (c)
38	may indicate the voter's selections by:
39	(1) touching a device on or in the squares immediately adjacent
40	to the name of a political party, candidate, or response to a public
41	question; or
42	(2) indicating the voter's choices by using a sip puff device that

1	enables the voter to indicate a choice by inhaling or exhaling.
2	SECTION 12. IC 3-11-14-3.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.141-2020,
3	SECTION 13, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 3.5. (a) Each county election board shall have the
5	names of all candidates for all elected offices, political party offices,
6	and public questions printed on ballot labels for use in an electronic
7	voting system as provided in this chapter.
8	(b) The county may:
9	(1) print all offices and public questions on a single ballot label;
10	and
11	(2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper
12	version of a ballot label is used within a precinct.
13	(c) Each type of ballot label must be of uniform size and of the same
14	quality and color of paper (except as permitted under IC 3-10-1-17).
15	(d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate
16	or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by
17	petitioners must be listed on the ballot label with the name and device
18	set forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the
19	device may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the
20	device. IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not
21	include a name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2)
22	or more parties or petitioners.
23	(e) The ballot labels must list the offices and public questions on the
24	general election ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12,
25	IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a),
26	IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c), IC 3-11-2-14(a), and
27	IC 3-11-2-14(d). Each office and public question may have a separate

30	(f) The name of each office must be printed in a uniform size in bold
31	type. A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
32	immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the

34	(1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be
35	elected to the office.
36	(2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be
37	elected) candidate(s) for this office.", To vote for any candidate
38	for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate
39	you wish to vote for. A straight party vote will not count as a vote
40	for any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1) candidate

is to be elected to the office.

(g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by



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1	subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be
2	grouped together in the following order:
3	(1) The major political party whose candidate received the highest
4	greatest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the
5	last most recent election for secretary of state is listed first.
6	(2) The major political party whose candidate received the second
7	highest greatest number of votes in the county for secretary of
8	state at the most recent election for secretary of state is listed
9	second.
10	(3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties'
11	candidates for secretary of state finished in the last most recent
12	election for secretary of state are listed after the party listed in
13	subdivision (2).
14	(4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of
15	state in the last most recent election for secretary of state or a
16	nominee is an independent candidate or independent ticket
17	(described in IC 3-11-2-6), the party or candidate is listed after
18	the parties described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
19	(5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate
20	or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the ballot,
21	the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in which
22	the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.
23	(6) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates listed
24	in subdivisions (1) through (5), if required by law. A space for
25	write-in voting for an office is not required if there are no
26	declared write-in candidates for that office. However, procedures
27	must be implemented to permit write-in voting for candidates for
28	federal offices.
29	(7) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the
30	ballot.
31	(h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established by
32	subsection (g) must be printed in type with uniform capital letters and
33	have a uniform space between each name. The name of the candidate's
34	political party, or the word "Independent", if the:
35	(1) candidate; or
36	(2) ticket of candidates for:
37	(A) President and Vice President of the United States; or
38	(B) governor and lieutenant governor;
39	is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name
40	of the candidate and must be printed in uniform size and type.
41	(i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to
42	at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision

10	(j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body
11	of a school corporation must be grouped:
12	(1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;

14	(2) in alphabetical order according to surname.
15	A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
16	immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
17	first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
18	candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office.".
19 20	(k) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7 must be placed at the top or beginning of the ballot label before the first public
21	question is listed.
22	(1) The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-8 IC 3-11-2-10(d), and
23	IC 3-11-2-10(e) IC 3-11-2-10(c) may be:
24	(1) placed on the ballot label; or
25	(2) posted in a location within the voting booth that permits the
26	voter to easily read the instructions.
27	(m) The ballot label must include: a touch sensitive point or button
28	for voting a straight political party or independent ticket (described in
29	IC 3-11-2-6) by one (1) touch, and the touch sensitive point or button
30	must be identified by:
31	(1) the name of the political party or independent ticket; and
32	(2) immediately below or beside the political party's or
33	independent ticket's name, the device of that party or ticket
34	(described in IC 3-11-2-5).
35	The name and device of each party or ticket must be of uniform size
36	and type, and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for
37	listing candidates under each office. The instructions described in
38	IC 3-11-2-10(c) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement

that voting system to permit a voter to skip a ballot screen) to continue
voting.".
(n) A public question must be in the form described in
IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a touch sensitive
point or button must be used instead of a square. Except as expressly
authorized or required by statute, a county election board may not print
a ballot label that contains language concerning the public question
other than the language authorized by a statute.

- (o) The requirements in this section:
  - (1) do not replace; and
- (2) are in addition to;

- any other requirements in this title that apply to ballots for electronic voting systems.
- (p) The procedure described in IC 3-11-2-16 must be used when a ballot label does not comply with the requirements imposed by this title or contains another error or omission that might result in confusion or mistakes by voters.

SECTION 13. IC 3-11-14-23, AS AMENDED BY P.L.21-2016, SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 23. (a) This section is enacted to comply with 52 U.S.C. 21081 by establishing uniform and nondiscriminatory standards to define what constitutes a vote on an electronic voting system.

- (b) If a voter is not challenged by a member of the precinct election board, the voter may pass the railing to the side where an electronic voting system is and into the voting booth. There the voter shall register the voter's vote in secret by indicating:
  - (1) the candidates for whom the voter desires to vote by touching a device on or in the squares immediately above the candidates' names;
  - (2) if the voter intends to cast a write-in vote, a write-in vote by touching a device on or in the square immediately below the candidates' names and printing the name of the candidate in the window provided for write-in voting; and
  - (3) the voter's preference on each public question by touching a device above the word "yes" or "no" under the question.
- (c) If an election is a general or municipal election and a voter desires to vote for all the candidates of one (1) political party or group of petitioners, the voter may east a straight party ticket by touching that party's device. Except as provided in IC 3-11-7.5-10(b), the voter's vote shall then be counted for all the candidates under that name. However, if the voter casts a vote by touching the circle of an independent ticket comprised of two (2) candidates, the vote shall not be counted for any



other independent candidate on the ballot.
(d) (c) As provided by 52 U.S.C. 21081, a voter casting a ballot on
an electronic voting system must be:

- (1) permitted to verify in a private and independent manner the votes selected by the voter before the ballot is cast and counted; (2) provided the opportunity to change the ballot or correct any error in a private and independent manner before the ballot is cast and counted, including the opportunity to receive a replacement ballot if the voter is otherwise unable to change or correct the ballot; and
- (3) notified before the ballot is cast regarding the effect of casting multiple votes for the office and provided an opportunity to correct the ballot before the ballot is cast and counted.

SECTION 14. IC 3-11-14.5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.135-2020, SECTION 5, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1. (a) Not later than seventy-four (74) days before election day, for each county planning to use an electronic voting system at the next election, VSTOP shall provide each county election board with a randomly sorted list of unique identification numbers for the inventory of machines in the county maintained under IC 3-11-16-4. Starting at the top of the list, the county election board shall select machines in the list in the order listed so that:

- (1) if a machine to be selected in the list is not scheduled to be used in the upcoming election, the selection process will move to the next machine in the order listed;
- (2) each selected machine is scheduled to be used in the upcoming election; and
- (3) the number of machines selected is not less than five percent (5%) of the machines in the county scheduled by the county election board to be used in the upcoming election.
- (b) The county election board shall test the machines as described in subsection (a) to ascertain that the machines will correctly count the votes cast for straight party tickets, for all candidates (including write-in candidates) and on all public questions. If an individual attending the public test requests that additional electronic voting systems be tested, then the county election board shall select and test additional machines from the list in the manner described in subsection (a).
- (c) If VSTOP does not provide the lists under subsection (a) not later than sixty (60) days before the election, the county election board shall establish and implement a procedure for random selection of not less than five percent (5%) of the machines in the county. The county



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1	election board shall then test the machines selected to be used in the
2	upcoming election as described in subsection (b).
3	(d) The testing under subsection (b) must begin before absentee
4	voting starts in the office of the circuit court clerk under IC 3-11-10-26.
5	(e) If a county election board determines that:
6	(1) a ballot provided by an electronic voting system:
7	(A) must be corrected as provided by IC 3-11-2-16 because of
8	the omission of a candidate, political party, or public question
9	from the ballot; or
10	(B) is an absentee ballot that a voter is entitled to recast under
11	IC 3-11.5-4-2 because the absentee ballot includes a candidate
12	for election to office who:
13	(i) ceased to be a candidate; and
14	(ii) has been succeeded by a candidate selected under
15	IC 3-13-1 or IC 3-13-2; and
16	(2) machines used in the test conducted under this section did not
17	contain a ballot that was reprinted or corrected to remove the
18	omission of a candidate, political party, or public question, or
19	indicate the name of the successor candidate;
20	the county election board shall conduct an additional public test
21	described in subsection (b) using the machines previously tested and
22	containing the reprinted or corrected ballots.
23	SECTION 15. IC 3-12-1-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.64-2014,
24	SECTION 68, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
25	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1. Subject to sections 5, 6, 7, <del>8,</del> 9, 9.5, and 13 of
26	this chapter, the primary factor to be considered in determining a

this chapter, the primary factor to be considered in determining a voter's choice on a ballot is the intent of the voter. If the voter's intent can be determined on the ballot or on part of the ballot, the vote shall be counted for the affected candidate or candidates or on the public question. However, if it is impossible to determine a voter's choice of candidates on a part of a ballot or vote on a public question, then the voter's vote concerning those candidates or public questions may not be counted.

SECTION 16. IC 3-12-1-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.278-2019, SECTION 137, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5. (a) This subsection does not apply to a ballot card voting system or an electronic voting system. Except as provided in subsection (d), A voting mark made by a voter on or in a voting square at the left of a candidate's name or political party's name shall be counted as a vote for the candidate. or candidates of the political party.

(b) This subsection applies to a ballot card voting system. A voting

The individual votes east by the voter for the office for the independent candidates, the declared write-in candidates, and the candidates of a political party other than the political party for which the voter east a straight party ticket, and the candidates of the political party for which the voter east a straight party ticket shall be counted unless the total number of these individual votes is greater than the number of persons to be elected to the office. The straight party ticket votes for the office shall not be counted. The straight party ticket votes for other offices on the voter's ballot shall be counted.

- (f) If a voter votes a straight party ticket for more than one (1) political party, the whole ballot is void with regard to all candidates nominated by a political party, declared write-in candidates, or candidates designated as independent candidates on the ballot. However, the voter's vote for a school board candidate or on a public question shall be counted if otherwise valid under this chapter.
- (g) (a) If a voter does not vote a straight party ticket and the number of votes cast by that a voter for the candidates for an office are less than or equal to the number of openings for that office, the individual candidates votes shall be counted.
- (h) (b) If a voter does not vote a straight party ticket and the number of votes cast by that a voter for an office exceeds the number of openings for that office, none of the votes concerning that office may be counted.

SECTION 18. IC 3-12-1-7.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.21-2016, SECTION 24, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 7.5. (a) If a voter votes for one (1) individual candidate for an office for which only one (1) person may be elected and also writes in the name of another candidate for the same office, neither vote may be counted.

- (b) If a voter votes for at least one (1) individual candidate for an office for which at least two (2) people may be elected and also writes in the name of at least one (1) candidate, the vote for that office may not be counted unless the number of individual votes cast for the office, when added to the number of write-in votes cast for that office, is less than or equal to the number of seats available for that office.
- (c) If a voter votes an individual or a straight party vote for a candidate for an office and also writes in the name of the same candidate for the same office, only one (1) vote for that candidate may be counted.
