Synopsis: Prescription drug importation study. Requires the state department of health to conduct a study and report to the legislative council concerning a state prescription drug importation program through which the state would import certain prescription drugs, including insulin, from Canada for Indiana consumers.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019] (a) As used in this
2	SECTION, "prescription drugs" includes insulin.
3	(b) As used in this SECTION, "program" refers to a
4	prescription drug importation program through which the state
5	would import certain prescription drugs from Canada for use by
6	Indiana consumers.
7	(c) The state department of health shall conduct a study of the
8	manner by which the state may conduct a program, including the
9	following:
10	(1) The procedure for certification of the state by the United
11	States Secretary of Health and Human Services to operate a
12	program.
13	(2) Methods of ensuring that prescription drugs imported
14	under a program meet the safety, effectiveness, and other
15	standards of the Food and Drug Administration of the United
16	States Department of Health and Human Services.
17	(3) Identification of prescription drugs with the highest

potential for consumer savings if imported through a



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1	program.
2	(4) Estimation of potential consumer savings attributable to
3	a program.
4	(5) Determination of a state contracted distributor of
5	prescription drugs imported under a program.
6	(6) Determination of a method of limiting distribution of
7	prescription drugs imported under a program to Indiana
8	consumers who would most benefit from the potential
9	consumer savings.
10	(7) Consultation with:
11	(A) the professional licensing agency;
12	(B) pharmaceutical industry representatives;
13	(C) patient advocates; and
14	(D) other persons anticipated to be affected by a
15	prescription drug importation program.
16	(d) The state department of health shall, not later than
17	November 1, 2019, report the following to the legislative council in
18	an electronic format under IC 5-14-6:
19	(1) The results of the study conducted under this SECTION.
20	(2) Recommendation for any proposed legislation to facilitate
21	establishment and implementation of a program.
22	(a) This SECTION expires July 1, 2020
