DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Synopsis: Internet and social media literacy education. Requires the department of education to develop curricula concerning Internet and social media literacy. Permits a school corporation to offer an elective course on Internet and social media literacy.

HOUSE BILL No. 1253

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

3	1, 2024]: Sec. 4. (a) The department shall develop grade level
4	appropriate curricula concerning Internet and social media
5	literacy for grades 6 through 12.
6	(b) The curricula developed under subsection (a) must include
7	the following topics:
8	(1) Cyberbullying (as defined in IC 20-19-3-11.5(a))
9	prevention and response.
10	(2) Digital ethics and etiquette, including identification of hate
11	speech, racism, and discrimination.
12	(3) Understanding the means by which to identify, access,
13	analyze, and evaluate the credibility of digital information.
14	(4) Safety and security awareness, including Internet
15	addiction, digital footprint, online predator practices, and
16	identification of fake profiles and fraudulent Internet
17	schemes.



(c) A school corporation may include in the school corporation's
middle school or high school curriculum an elective course
concerning Internet and social media literacy developed under this
section.
(d) An elective course described in subsection (c) may satisfy one

(d) An elective course described in subsection (c) may satisfy one (1) health and wellness credit for the general, Core 40, Core 40 with academic honors, and Core 40 with technical honors designation.

9 (e) The department may determine and provide incentives to a 10 school corporation that includes an elective course as described in 11 subsection (c).



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
