HOUSE BILL No. 1260

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 2-5-46 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON
3	PASSAGE]:
4	Chapter 46. Migrant Farmworkers Policy Development Study
5	Commission
6	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the
7	migrant farmworkers policy development study commission
8	established by section 2 of this chapter.
9	Sec. 2. The migrant farmworkers policy development study
10	commission is established.
11	Sec. 3. (a) The commission shall consist of thirteen (13)
12	members, who shall be appointed as follows:
13	(1) Two (2) members of the senate, of whom:
14	(A) one (1) shall be appointed by the president pro tempore
15	of the senate and shall serve as co-chair of the commission;
16	and
17	(B) one (1) shall be appointed by the minority leader of the



1	senate.
2	(2) Two (2) members of the house of representatives, of
3	whom:
4	(A) one (1) shall be appointed by the speaker of the house
5	of representatives and shall serve as co-chair of the
6	commission; and
7	(B) one (1) shall be appointed by the minority leader of the
8	house of representatives.
9	(3) One (1) member who is an employee of the state
10	department of health, appointed by the governor.
11	(4) One (1) member who is an employee of the state
12	department of agriculture, appointed by the governor.
13	(5) One (1) member who is an employee of the department of
14	workforce development, appointed by the governor.
15	(6) One (1) member who is an employee of the department of
16	education, appointed by the governor.
17	(7) Three (3) members who have broad experience providing
18	services to or advocating for migrant and seasonal
19	farmworkers in the state, appointed by the legislative council.
20	(8) Two (2) members who have broad experience in
21	agriculture and hiring migrant and seasonal farmworkers,
22	appointed by the legislative council.
23	(b) The members of the commission must be selected so as to
24	give representation to the various geographical areas of Indiana.
25	(c) If a legislative member of the commission ceases to be a
26	member of the chamber from which the member was appointed,
27	the person ceases to be a member of the commission.
28	(d) The term of a member is two (2) years.
29	(e) If:
30	(1) the term of a member expires;
31	(2) the member is not reappointed; and
32	(3) a successor is not appointed;
33	the term of the member continues until a successor is appointed.
34	(f) All initial appointments to the commission must be made not
35	later than July 1, 2020.
36	Sec. 4. (a) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled by the
37	original appointing authority.
38	(b) If the office of a co-chair becomes vacant, the commission
39	shall elect a person to fill the vacancy from among the legislative
40	members of the commission.

Sec. 5. (a) A majority of the members of the commission



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constitutes a quorum.

1	(b) The affirmative vote of at least a majority of the members of
2	the commission is necessary for the commission to take any final
3	action.
4	(c) The commission shall meet at the call of the co-chairs.
5	Sec. 6. Subject to applicable statutes and policies established by
6	the legislative council, the commission, by resolution, may adopt
7	rules and create committees, consisting of its members, necessary
8	for the proper conduct of its business.
9	Sec. 7. Each legislative member and each lay member of the
10	commission is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and
11	travel allowances paid to individuals serving as legislative and lay
12	members, respectively, on an interim study committee established
13	by the legislative council.
14	Sec. 8. The legislative services agency shall provide staff support
15	to the commission.
16	Sec. 9. Funds necessary to carry out this chapter shall be
17	allotted to the commission from funds appropriated to the
18	legislative council.
19	Sec. 10. Subject to standards set by statute and the policies
20	established by the legislative council, the commission may accept
21	money or services from any public or private source to carry out
22	this chapter.
23	Sec. 11. The commission shall submit reports in an electronic
24	format under IC 5-14-6 to the legislative council as and when
25	requested by the council.
26	Sec. 12. The commission shall do the following:
27	(1) Study and evaluate existing statutes and policies regulating
28	agricultural labor camps in the state, which must include
29	reviewing statutes and policies regarding the following:
30	(A) The inspection and investigation of agricultural labor
31	camps.
32	(B) The enforcement and penalty process for agricultural
33	labor camps in violation of law.
34	(2) Study and evaluate existing and potential funding sources
35	for the construction of agricultural labor camps.
36	(3) Examine the workload and hiring requirements for state
37	department of health investigators charged with inspecting
38	and investigating agricultural labor camps.
39	(4) Promote information sharing concerning migrant
40	farmworkers and agricultural labor camps across Indiana.
41	(5) Submit a report not later than September 1 of each year
42	regarding the commission's work during the previous year.



1	The report must be submitted to the legislative council and
2	the governor.
3	Sec. 13. The legislative council may refer any issue related to
4	agricultural labor camps or migrant farmworkers to the
5	commission for study. If a matter is referred to the commission
6	under this section, the commission shall study that matter and
7	report to the legislative council as requested by the legislative

SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
