DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-21-17.

Synopsis: Hospital pricing information and penalties. Requires a hospital to post certain pricing information on the hospital's website. Sets forth civil penalties for the Indiana department of health to assess a hospital or ambulatory outpatient surgical center that fails to post the pricing information.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

HOUSE BILL No. 1272

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-21-17-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.151-2021,
2	SECTION 11 AND P.L.198-2021, SECTION 14, IS AMENDED TO
3	READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 1. (a) Not
4	later than December 31, 2021, An ambulatory outpatient surgical
5	center shall post on the Internet web site website of the ambulatory
6	outpatient surgical center pricing and other information specified in
7	this chapter for the following:
8	(1) For as many of the seventy (70) shoppable services specified
9	in the final rule of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
10	Services published in 84 FR 65524 that are provided by the
11	ambulatory outpatient surgical center.
12	(2) In addition to the services specified in subdivision (1):
13	(A) the thirty (30) most common services that are provided by
14	the ambulatory outpatient surgical center not included in
15	subdivision (1); or
16	(B) if the ambulatory outpatient surgical center offers less than
17	thirty (30) services not included under subdivision (1), all of



1	the services provided by the ambulatory outpatient surgical
2	center.
3	(b) The following information, to the extent applicable, must be
4	included on the Internet web site website by an ambulatory outpatient
5	surgical center for the shoppable and common services described in
6	subsection (a):
7	(1) A description of the shoppable and common service.
8	(2) The standard charge per item or service for each of the
9	following categories:
10	(A) Any nongovernment sponsored health benefit plan or
11	insurance plan provided by a health carrier in which the
12	provider is in the network.
13	(B) Medicare, including fee for service and Medicare
14	Advantage.
15	(C) Self-pay without charitable assistance from the ambulatory
16	outpatient surgical center.
17	(D) Self-pay with charitable assistance from the ambulatory
18	outpatient surgical center.
19	(E) Medicaid, including fee for service and risk based
20	managed care.
21	(c) I f:
22	(1) the federal Hospital Price Transparency Rule is repealed; or
23	(2) federal enforcement of the federal Hospital Price
24	Transparency Rule is stopped;
25	the state health commissioner shall notify the legislative council of the
26	occurrence referred to in subdivision (1) or (2) in an electronic format
27	under IC 5-14-6.
28	(d) This subsection takes effect when the legislative council receives
29	a notification from the state health commissioner under subsection (c).
30	(c) A hospital shall post on the hospital's website pricing
31	information in compliance with the federal Hospital Price
32	Transparency Rule of the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
33	Services as published at 84 FR 65524 and in effect on January 1, 2021.
34	SECTION 2. IC 16-21-17-3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
35	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
36	1, 2023]: Sec. 3. (a) The state department may assess the following
37	civil penalties against a hospital that fails to post the information
38	required under section 1 of this chapter:
39	(1) For a hospital with less than thirty-one (31) beds, three
40	hundred dollars (\$300) per day.
41	(2) For a hospital with at least thirty-one (31) beds, but not
42	more than five hundred fifty (550) beds, the number of beds



1	for the hospital multiplied by ten dollars (\$10) per day.
2	(3) For a hospital with more than five hundred fifty (550)
3	beds, five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) per day.
4	(b) The state department may assess a civil penalty against an
5	ambulatory outpatient surgical center that fails to post the
6	information required under section 1 of this chapter. The penalty
7	may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each day the
8	information is not posted.
