## **HOUSE BILL No. 1311**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 7.1-3-28; IC 7.1-4-4.1-12.5; IC 7.1-5-7-11.

**Synopsis:** Gift package permit. Establishes a gift package permit that allows a person who: (1) is solely engaged in the retail sale of gifts and flowers; and (2) does not have an interest in an alcoholic beverage permit; to sell and deliver gift packages that contain gifts, flowers, floral arrangements, potted plants, and beer and wine. Establishes requirements for: (1) hours; (2) verifying the age of purchasers and recipients; and (3) record keeping; of sales and deliveries of gift packages. Allows a minor to be on the licensed premises of a business with a gift package permit. Establishes a fee of \$100 annually for a gift package permit that is deposited into the enforcement and administration fund of the alcohol and tobacco commission.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1311**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-28 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2020]:
4	Chapter 28. Gift Package Permit
5	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "permit" means a gift package
6	permit issued under this chapter.
7	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "permittee" means a person who
8	has an interest in a gift package permit.
9	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "proof of age" means:
10	(1) a driver's license;
11	(2) an identification card issued under IC 9-24-16-1, or a
12	similar card issued under the laws of another state or the
13	federal government; or
14	(3) a government issued document;
15	that bears a person's photograph and birth date.
16	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "purchaser" means a person who
17	purchases a gift package under this chapter.



1	Sec. 5. The commission may issue a permit to a person who:
2 3	(1) is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
	(2) is solely engaged in the retail sale and delivery of:
4	(A) gifts; and
5	(B) flowers, floral arrangements, and potted plants; and
6	(3) does not have an interest in any other alcoholic beverage
7	permit of any type.
8	Sec. 6. (a) A permit allows a permittee to sell gift packages
9	containing gifts, flowers, floral arrangements, or potted plants, and
10	alcoholic beverages as described in subsection (b) for consumption
11	off the licensed premises. A permit does not allow a permittee to
12	sell a gift package containing only alcoholic beverages.
13	(b) A gift package may contain beer or wine, or beer and wine,
14	in their original packages, not to exceed:
15	(1) two (2) seven hundred fifty (750) milliliter bottles of wine;
16	and
17	(2) seventy-two (72) ounces of beer contained in bottles, cans,
18	or both bottles and cans.
19	(c) A gift package may only be sold for the personal use of the
20	recipient and not for resale or other commercial purposes.
21	Sec. 7. A permittee may purchase beer and wine from a holder
22	of any of the following permits:
23	(1) A dealer permit.
24	(2) A wholesaler permit.
25	(3) A farm winery permit.
26	(4) A brewer's permit under IC 7.1-3-2-7(5).
27	Sec. 8. A permittee may:
28	(1) sell gift packages only during:
29	(A) the regular business hours of the permittee; and
30	(B) the hours that a dealer may sell alcoholic beverages
31	under IC 7.1-3-1-14; and
32	(2) deliver gift packages Monday through Saturday from 8
33	a.m. until 7 p.m.
34	Sec. 9. (a) A permittee may receive and fill orders for gift
35	packages that a purchaser places in person or transmits by
36	electronic or other means, if the purchaser provides the following:
37	(1) The purchaser's name, mailing address, telephone
38	number, and proof of age that shows that the purchaser is at
39	least twenty-one (21) years of age. Proof of age may be
40	evidenced:
41	(A) in person; or
42	(B) if the purchaser places the order by telephone or



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2	electronically: (i) by a photocopy or facsimile copy that is mailed or
3	electronically transmitted;
4	(ii) by a computer scanned, electronically transmitted
5	copy; or
6	(iii) through an age verification service used by the
7	permittee.
8	(2) The recipient's name, delivery address, and telephone
9	number. A post office box is not a valid delivery address. The
10	recipient's business address, or the address of a temporary
11	residence including a room of a hotel, motel, or other
12	temporary lodging, is considered a valid delivery address.
13	(b) A permittee must receive full payment for the purchase of
14	the gift package before delivery.
15	Sec. 10. (a) An employee of a permittee who is at least nineteen
16	(19) years of age may receive and process payments for sales
17	orders for gift packages in the course of the employee's
18	employment as permitted under IC 7.1-5-7-13(a)(2).
19	(b) A gift package may be delivered only by:
20	(1) the permittee; or
21	(2) an employee of the permittee;
22	who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age. However, a person
23	eighteen (18) years of age or older may assist in deliveries subject
24	to the requirements of IC 7.1-5-7-13(a)(4).
25	Sec. 11. (a) All gift packages must have the following label on
26	the outside of the gift package: "CONTAINS ALCOHOLIC
27	BEVERAGES. SIGNATURE OF PERSON AGE 21 OR OLDER
28	REQUIRED FOR DELIVERY.".
29	(b) The individual who personally receives and signs for the gift
30	package must present proof of age. A gift package may not be
31	delivered unless the person delivering the package verifies that the
32	individual who personally receives and signs for the delivery is at
33	least twenty-one (21) years of age.
34	Sec. 12. A permittee shall maintain for at least one (1) year a
35	written record of each sale and delivery that contains the
36	following:
37	(1) The purchaser's name, address, and telephone number.
38	(2) A copy of the purchaser's proof of age.
39	(3) The date, time, and location of:
40	(A) the purchase; and
41	(B) the delivery.
42	(4) The quantity of alcoholic beverages purchased.

7	Sec. 13. This chapter does not affect, prevent, or impose any
8	additional requirements upon a dealer permittee or other
9	permittee that may, under the authority of the permittee's
10	alcoholic beverage permit, sell and deliver gift packages that
11	contain alcoholic beverages to consumers.
12	SECTION 2. IC 7.1-4-4.1-12.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
13	CODE AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
14	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 12.5. (a) An annual permit fee of
15	one hundred dollars (\$100) is imposed for the issuance of a gift
16	package permit under IC 7.1-3-28.
17	(b) The commission shall deposit all fees collected for the
18	issuance of gift package permits into the enforcement and
19	administration fund established under IC 7.1-4-10.
20	SECTION 3. IC 7.1-5-7-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.285-2019,
21	SECTION 59, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
22	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 11. (a) The provisions of sections 9 and 10 of this
23	chapter shall not apply if the public place involved is one (1) of the

2	space of a food hall vendor permittee under IC 7.1-3-20-30 that
3	serves alcoholic beverages intended to be consumed while sitting

5	(31) A business to which IC 7.1-3-28 applies.
6	(b) For the purpose of this subsection, "food" means meals prepared
7	on the licensed premises. It is lawful for a minor to be on licensed
8	premises in a room in which is located a bar over which alcoholic
9	beverages are sold or dispensed by the drink if all the following
10	conditions are met:
11	(1) The minor is eighteen (18) years of age or older.
12	(2) The minor is in the company of a parent, guardian, or family
13	member who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
14	(3) The purpose for being on the licensed premises is the
15	consumption of food and not the consumption of alcoholic
16	beverages.
