DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-28-7-7; IC 22-4.1-25.

Workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot program. Establishes a workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot program for the purpose of demonstrating a coordinated training program that provides training and other services to: (1) incumbent workers of participating employers to allow those workers to qualify for higher paying positions; and (2) unemployed or underemployed individuals, particularly people with intellectual and other developmental disabilities, to allow those individuals to qualify for job openings created by incumbent workers taking new positions. Establishes a seven member task force to implement and administer the pilot program. Requires the task force to implement the pilot program not later than October 1, 2018. Appropriates to the task force from the skills enhancement training fund and the rehabilitation services fund amounts sufficient to provide: (1) grants to employers and providers of training and other services that are participating in the pilot program; (2) reimbursement of employer costs related to the hiring and training of new employees related to the pilot program; and (3) grants to incumbent workers of an employer participating in the pilot program to pay the costs related to the worker earning a portable, industry recognized certification or credential. Appropriates on July 1 each year, for the years 2018 and 2019, to a training institute for people with disabilities from the skills enhancement training fund \$1,750,000 for curriculum development, operating expenses, and marketing expenses. Requires the Indiana economic development corporation to submit a report to the budget committee each year concerning the training institute's use of the money.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2018.

HOUSE BILL No. 1329

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 5-28-7-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2018]: Sec. 7. (a) On July 1 each year there is appropriated to a
4	training institute for people with disabilities that meets the criteria
5	listed in subsection (b) one million seven hundred fifty thousand
6	dollars (\$1,750,000) from the skills enhancement training fund for
7	curriculum development, operating expenses, and marketing
8	expenses.
9	(b) In order for a training institute to receive the money
10	appropriated under subsection (a), the training institute shall
11	comply with all of the following:
12	(1) The institute provides an independent living experience for
13	its trainees.
14	(2) The institute provides training on job skills in various
15	career fields, including soft work skills.
16	(3) The institute provides training on community living skills.
17	(4) The institute is affiliated with a statewide organization



1	that advocates for people with intellectual and other
2	developmental disabilities.
3	(5) The institute was established before July 1, 2018.
4	(c) The corporation shall submit a report to the budget
5	committee each year concerning the training institute's use of the
6	money received under subsection (a).
7	(d) This section expires June 30, 2020.
8	SECTION 2. IC 22-4.1-25 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
9	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
10	UPON PASSAGE]:
11	Chapter 25. Workforce Inclusion and Opportunity Pilot
12	Program
13	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "pilot program" refers to the
14	workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot program established by
15	section 3 of this chapter.
16	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "task force" refers to the
17	workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot program task force
18	established by section 4 of this chapter.
19	Sec. 3. The workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot program
20	is established for the purpose of demonstrating a coordinated
21	training program that provides training and other services to:
22	(1) incumbent workers of participating employers to allow
23 24	those workers to qualify for higher paying positions; and
24	(2) unemployed or underemployed individuals, particularly
25	focusing on people with intellectual and other developmental
26	disabilities, to allow those individuals to qualify for job
27	openings created by the workers described in subdivision (1)
28	taking new positions.
29	Sec. 4. (a) The workforce inclusion and opportunity pilot
30	program task force is established.
31	(b) The task force consists of seven (7) members as follows:
32	(1) The director of the division of disability and rehabilitative
33	services.
34	(2) One (1) member representing the department of
35	workforce development appointed by the governor.
36	(3) One (1) member representing the Indiana economic
37	development corporation appointed by the governor.
38	(4) One (1) member representing a statewide nonprofit
39	organization that advocates for people with intellectual and
10	other developmental disabilities appointed by the governor.
11	(5) One (1) member representing a trade association of
12	providers that deliver services to people with intellectual and



1	other developmental disabilities appointed by the governor.
2	(6) One (1) member representing the manufacturing
3	community in Indiana appointed by the governor.
4	(7) One (1) member representing the business community in
5	Indiana appointed by the governor.
6	(c) The appointed members of the task force serve at the
7	pleasure of the governor.
8	(d) If a vacancy of an appointed member on the task force
9	occurs, the governor shall appoint an individual to fill the vacancy
10	using the criteria in subsection (b).
11	(e) The director of the division of disability and rehabilitative
12	services shall serve as the chair of the task force.
13	(f) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
14	quorum for the purpose of conducting business.
15	(g) The affirmative votes of a majority of the members of the
16	task force are required for the task force to take official action.
17	(h) The division of disability and rehabilitative services shall:
18	(1) provide staff and administrative support to the task force;
19	and
20	(2) pay the expenses of the task force.
21	Sec. 5. (a) Each member of the task force who is not a state
22	employee is entitled to the following:
23	(1) The salary per diem provided under IC 4-10-11-2.1(b).
24	(2) Reimbursement for traveling expenses provided under
25	IC 4-13-1-4.
26	(3) Other expenses actually incurred in connection with the
27	member's duties as provided by state policies and procedures
28	established by the department of administration and
29	approved by the budget agency.
30	(b) Each member of the task force who is a state employee is
31	entitled to the following:
32	(1) Reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
33	IC 4-13-1-4.
34	(2) Other expenses actually incurred in connection with the
35	member's duties as provided by state policies and procedures
36	established by the department of administration and
37	approved by the budget agency.
38	Sec. 6. The task force shall do all of the following:
39	(1) Select a geographic region in which to conduct the pilot
40	program based on the presence of employers and nonprofit
41	disability services providers having an interest in
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participating in the pilot program.



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1	(2) Select the employers to participate in the pilot program.
2	(3) Select the providers of training and other services to
3	participate in the pilot program. The providers selected must
4	include:
5	(A) those that will provide training and other services to
6	incumbent workers; and
7	(B) those that will provide training and other services to
8	unemployed or underemployed individuals, focusing on
9	individuals with intellectual and other developmental
10	disabilities.
11	(4) Enter into contracts and agreements with employers and
12	training and services providers to provide training and other
13	services for the pilot program.
14	(5) Implement, not later than October 1, 2018, the pilot
15	program.
16	(6) Administer and coordinate the pilot program.
17	(7) Disburse, allocate, and account for money appropriated to
18	the task force from the skills enhancement fund (established
19	by IC 5-28-7-5) and the rehabilitation services fund
20	(established by IC 12-12-1-9) for the following:
21	(A) Training grants to employers participating in the pilot
22	program.
23	(B) Training grants to providers that are participating in
24	the pilot program for services to incumbent workers,
25	underemployed workers, or unemployed individuals, with
26	an emphasis on people with intellectual and other
27	developmental disabilities.
28	(C) Reimbursement of employer costs related to the hiring
29	and training of employees who fill job openings created by
30	the employer's incumbent workers taking new positions
31	under the pilot program.
32	(D) Grants to incumbent workers of an employer
33	participating in the pilot program to pay the costs related
34	to earning a portable, industry recognized certification or
35	credential. A worker does not need to be enrolled as a
36	student at the postsecondary educational institution in
37	order to be eligible for a grant under this clause.
38	(8) Not later that December 1, 2019, submit to the governor
39	and, in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6, to the legislative
40	council a report concerning results obtained by the pilot
41	program, including recommendations for improving and

expanding the program.



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1	Sec. 7. There is appropriated to the task force from the skills
2	enhancement fund (established by IC 5-28-7-5) and the
3	rehabilitation services fund (established by IC 12-12-1-9) amounts
4	sufficient to provide the grants and reimbursements described in
5	section 6(7) of this chapter to carry out the pilot program.
5	Sec. 8. This chapter expires January 1, 2020.
7	SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.
