DIGEST OF HB 1347 (Updated January 22, 2020 11:19 am - DI 75)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

**Synopsis:** Bureau of motor vehicles. Requires the bureau to provide recommendations to the general assembly to move from physical certificates of registration and physical proofs of registration to electronic certificates of registration and electronic proofs of registration.

Effective: Upon passage.

#### **HOUSE BILL No. 1347**

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this 2 SECTION, "bureau" refers to the bureau of motor vehicles 3 created by IC 9-14-7-1.

4 (b) The bureau shall submit a report to the legislative council before August 1, 2020, in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 that 6 recommends to the general assembly any statutory changes that must be enacted to permit the elimination of physical certificates of registration or physical proofs of registration (except for a license plate) for any person applying for registration under 10 IC 9-18.1. The report must include any recommendations for statutory changes that would permit the bureau to issue electronic certificates of registration and electronic proofs of registration.

13 (c) All other state agencies shall cooperate with the bureau as 14 necessary for the bureau to complete the report required by this 15 SECTION.

16 (d) This SECTION expires January 1, 2021.

17 SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Roads and Transportation, to which was referred House Bill 1347, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Delete the title and insert the following:

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning motor vehicles.

Page 1, delete lines 1 through 12, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this SECTION, "bureau" refers to the bureau of motor vehicles created by IC 9-14-7-1.

(b) The bureau shall submit a report to the legislative council before August 1, 2020, in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 that recommends to the general assembly any statutory changes that must be enacted to permit the elimination of physical certificates of registration or physical proofs of registration (except for a license plate) for any person applying for registration under IC 9-18.1. The report must include any recommendations for statutory changes that would permit the bureau to issue electronic certificates of registration and electronic proofs of registration.

(c) All other state agencies shall cooperate with the bureau as necessary for the bureau to complete the report required by this SECTION.

(d) This SECTION expires January 1, 2021.

SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.".
