DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-3-27.

Synopsis: Governor's workforce cabinet. Makes changes to the membership of the governor's workforce cabinet. Requires the governor's workforce cabinet to work with stakeholders from prekindergarten through grade 20 and representatives of the workforce to establish alignment and coordination between the early learning advisory committee, state board of education, commission for higher education, and department of workforce development.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

HOUSE BILL No. 1419

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

12	use of funds and resources consistent with the laws and
13	regulations governing the particular applicable state and federal

15	(2) Advise the governor, general assembly, commission for
16	higher education, and state board of education on:
17	(A) the development and implementation of state and local

2	(B) the coordination of the standards and measures;
3	concerning the applicable federal programs.
4	(3) Perform the duties as set forth in federal law of the particular
5	advisory bodies for applicable federal programs described in
6	section 4 of this chapter.
7	(4) Identify the workforce needs in Indiana and recommend to the
8	governor, general assembly, commission for higher education
9	and state board of education goals to meet the investment needs
10	(5) Recommend to the governor, general assembly, commission
1	for higher education, and state board of education goals for the
12	development and coordination of the talent development system
13	in Indiana.
14	(6) Prepare and recommend to the governor, general assembly
15	commission for higher education, and state board of education a
16	strategic plan to accomplish the goals developed under
17	subdivisions (4) and (5).
18	(7) Monitor and direct the implementation of and evaluate the
19	effectiveness of the strategic plan described in subdivision (6).
20	(8) Advise the governor, general assembly, commission for
21	higher education, and state board of education on the
22	coordination of federal, state, and local education and training
23 24	programs and on the allocation of state and federal funds in
24	Indiana to promote effective services, service delivery, and
25	innovative programs.
26	(9) Review and approve regional workforce development board
27	plans, and work with regional workforce development boards to
28	determine appropriate metrics for workforce programming at the
29	state and local levels.
30	(10) Design for implementation a comprehensive career
31	navigation and coaching system as described in section 11 of this
32	chapter.
33	(11) Conduct a systematic and comprehensive review, analysis
34	and evaluation of workforce funding described in section 12 o
35	this chapter.
36	(12) Conduct a systematic and comprehensive review, analysis
37	and evaluation of the college and career funding described in
38	section 13 of this chapter.
39	(13) Based on the reviews in sections 12 and 13 of this chapter
1 0	direct the appropriate state agencies to implement administrative
1 1	changes to the delivery of these programs that align with Indiana's
12	workforce goals, and make recommendations to:

5	format under IC 5-14-6;
6	on possible legislative changes in the future.
7	(14) Study the advisability of establishing one (1) or more real
8	world career readiness programs as described in section 14 of this
9	chapter and report to:
10	(A) the governor;
11	(B) the commission for higher education;
12	(C) the state board of education; and
13	(D) the legislative council general assembly in an electronic
14	format under IC 5-14-6;
15	concerning the results of the study.
16	(15) Conduct a systematic and comprehensive review, analysis,
17	and evaluation of whether:
18	(A) Indiana's primary, secondary, and postsecondary
19	education systems are aligned with employer needs; and
20	(B) Indiana's students and workforce are prepared for success
21	in the twenty-first century economy.
22	(16) Create a comprehensive strategic plan to ensure alignment
23	between Indiana's primary, secondary, and postsecondary
24	education systems with Indiana's workforce training programs
25	and employer needs.
26	(17) Administer the workforce diploma reimbursement
27	program established by IC 22-4.1-27-7.
28	(18) Work with stakeholders from prekindergarten through
29	grade 20 and representatives of the workforce to establish
30	alignment and coordination between the early learning
31	advisory committee (established by IC 12-17.2-3.8-5), state
32	board of education, commission for higher education, and
33	department of workforce development.
34	(17) (16) (18) (19) Carry out other policy duties and tasks as
35	assigned by the governor.

18	education directors appointed by the governor in consultation
19	with the Indiana Association of Career and Technical Education

21	(11) (13) A member representing manufacturing appointed by the
22	governor in consultation with the Indiana Manufacturers
23	Association.
24	(12) (14) A member representing a minority business enterprise
24 25	appointed by the governor.
26	(13) (15) A member representing a women's business enterprise
27	appointed by the governor.
28	(14) (16) A member representing a veteran owned business
29	appointed by the governor.
30	(15) (17) A member representing the nonunion and construction
31	trades appointed by the governor in consultation with the
32	Associated Builders and Contractors, Inc., and the Indiana
33	Builders Association.
34	(16) (18) A business owner appointed by the governor in
35	consultation with the Indiana Chamber of Commerce.
36	(17) (19) A small business owner appointed by the governor in
37	consultation with the National Federation of Independent
38	Businesses.
39	(18) (20) A member of a community-based organization
40	appointed by the governor.
41	(19) (21) Three (3) at-large business owners appointed by the
12	governor one (1) of whom is a husiness owner who employs less



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than fifty (50) employees.
(22) A school principal, appointed by the governor.
(23) A school superintendent, appointed by the governor.
(24) A member representing the Indiana State Teacher's
Association, selected by the Indiana State Teacher's
Association.
(20) (25) A member of the house of representatives appointed by
the speaker of the house of representatives who serves as a
nonvoting member. Two (2) members appointed by the speaker
of the house of representatives from different political parties.
(21) (26) A member of the senate appointed by the president pro
tempore of the senate who serves as a nonvoting member. Two
(2) members appointed by the president pro tempore of the
senate from different political parties.
(22) (27) Any additional members designated and appointed by
the governor.
(b) The members appointed under subsection (a)(11) (a)(13)
through (a)(19) (a)(21) must be geographically diverse.
