

SENATE BILL No. 3

DIGEST OF SB 3 (Updated January 23, 2019 10:42 am - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 10-11.

Synopsis: Internet crimes against children fund. Establishes the Internet crimes against children fund (fund). Appropriates \$2,000,000 annually from the state general fund to the fund. Requires the state police department (department) to administer the fund and use money in the fund to: (1) pay for costs incurred by the department for training and purchasing equipment for the investigation of offenses that involve the use of the Internet in which a child is the alleged victim; and (2) award grants to county, city, and town law enforcement agencies that agree to use the money to investigate Internet crimes against children in accordance with United States Department of Justice Internet Crimes Against Children Operational and Investigative Standards.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 10-11-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE.

9	established.
10	(b) The fund consists of appropriations from the general
11	assembly.
12	(c) The fund may be used only for the purposes described in
13	sections 4 and 5 of this chapter.
14	(d) The fund shall be administered by the department.
15	(e) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
16	money in the fund.
17	Sec. 3. There is annually appropriated to the fund two million



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1	dollars (\$2,000,000) from the state general fund for use in carrying
2	out the purposes of this chapter.
3	Sec. 4. The department shall use money in the fund to pay for
4	costs incurred by the department for training and purchasing
5	equipment for the investigation of offenses:
6	(1) that involve the use of the Internet; and
7	(2) in which a child is the alleged victim.
8	Sec. 5. (a) The department shall use not more than fifty percent
9	(50%) of the money deposited in the fund during a state fiscal year
10	to award grants to county, city, and town law enforcement agencies
1	that agree to use the money to investigate Internet crimes against
12	children in accordance with United States Department of Justice
13	Internet Crimes Against Children Operational and Investigative
14	Standards.
15	(b) The department shall establish:
16	(1) the amounts of grants awarded under this section; and
17	(2) criteria used to award grants under this section, which
18	may include any of the following:
19	(A) The geographic location and population of the
20	jurisdiction of a law enforcement agency.
21 22	(B) The number of reports of Internet crimes against
22	children within the jurisdiction of a law enforcement
23 24	agency.
24	(C) The past and current participation of a law
25	enforcement agency in the department's Internet crimes
26	against children task force.
27	(c) A county, city, or town law enforcement agency that wishes
28	to receive a grant from the fund under this section must file a
29	written application for the grant:
30	(1) on a form; and
31	(2) in the manner;
